APPEARANCES – Engineers Jesse Wendel and Joe Lindstrom of IBC Engineering P.C. appeared before the Board to present

recommendations relative to the Village Hall HVAC Upgrade Schematic Design Report, dated June 2005 (IBC Project No. 05517). Engineering, P.C. was commissioned by the Village to investigate, analyze, evaluate and design the replacement of the HVAC system presently installed in the Village Hall and thereafter IBC developed two options: Option #1 involving a horizontal heat pump system and Option #2 involving replacement of the existing Air Handling Unit and VAV system in kind. Senior Mechanical Engineer Joe Lindstrom explained that IBC Engineering recommends proceeding with Option #1 for the 1) the system is incremental; 2) 30-40% more following reasons: efficient; 3) on-demand heating/cooling; 4) water cooled equipment; and 5) constant volume system. It is expected that the higher initial cost for said system would be offset quickly with increased energy efficiency. Also, Mr. Lindstrom indicated that IBC would recommend 1) dropping the ceiling several inches in the lower level of the Village Hall to better accommodate the heat pump system and 2) replacing the outdated lighting, but that said ceiling and lighting work was not included in the executive summary of costs.

PUBLIC COMMENT – No one appeared to speak.

Brooklyn Street Sidewalk/Restoration Project – Supt. Kowalik reported that the new sidewalks are in and that 75% of the landscape restoration is complete.
