House at the Water Plant scheduled for Saturday, June 12, 2010 between 11:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. Other items discussed were: Recommending Marshall Avenue waterline replacement, storm sewer rehab and street construction be placed on the agenda under Project Reports; reported receiving the design from the Village Engineer for the Marshall Avenue Project; Town of Newstead will be assisting the Village with oiling and chipping Jackson Street, Skyline Drive and Knapp Road; Power outage reported after the severe weather over the weekend where 5" of rain fell in a 12 hour period, causing some drainage issues at the joint facility site as well as other areas in the Village; hydroseeding was completed at the joint facility which helps keep the soil in place and the dust down; discussion was held regarding stop signs in the Village and the need for a speed study on Hake Road.

WHEREAS, the bids for the project have been reviewed by Christa Construction and reviewed and approved by the joint committee of the Town and Village and based on their recommendation have determined that the following contractors listed in Attachment A are the low bidders on the joint municipal works facility:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE VILLAGE BOARD AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The Village Board does hereby determine that Picone Corporation is the low bidder for General Trades, Building Innovation Group is the low bidder for Concrete Flatwork, Building Innovation Group is the low bidder for Masonry, MJ Mechanical is the low bidder for HVAC, MKS Plumbing Corp is the low bidder for Fire Protection, Callea Electric, Inc is the low bidder for electrical, Milherst Construction, Inc is the low bidder for Site/Utility Improvements, Gypsum Systems, Inc is the low bidder for Interior Assemblies and RW Painting Inc is the low bidder for Painting and approves the bids as set forth in Attachment A.
- 2. The Mayor is authorized to execute a contract with each of the above contractors following review and approval of the required contract documents by the Village Attorney.
- 3. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
