APPEARANCES – Northern Erie Sno-Seekers Representative Richard McNamara came before the Board to discuss the upcoming snowmobiling season. He stated that the club purchased a new grooming machine for the trails and that speed signs, barrels and trash receptacles will be placed on the trails by December 19. Trustee Forrestel wanted to mention that several reflectors located on the bridge need to be

replaced and to remind the club of the placement and removal of the rubber belting on the bridge.

RESOLUTION duly moved by Middaugh and seconded by Wittlinger to accept agreement with the Northern Erie Sno-Seekers for the 2009-2010 winter season.

WHEREAS, the Village of Akron has received a request from the Northern Erie Sno-Seekers, Inc., to use a portion of the Bike Path in the Village of Akron for snowmobile use;

WHEREAS, the Northern Erie Sno-Seekers, Inc., contacted the Village Board on December 7, 2009 to renew their permission to use a portion of the Bike Path in the Village of Akron for snowmobile use;

NOW, THEREFORE, A RESOLUTION, duly moved by Middaugh, seconded by Wittlinger, based on information submitted by the Northern Erie Sno-Seekers, Inc., and upon the Village's review, the Village Board authorizes the Northern Erie Sno-Seekers, Inc., to use the Bike Path within the Village of Akron from December 20, 2009 through April 1, 2010, subject to random enforcement of speed, unreasonable noise and DWI, be and hereby is approved by the Village Board, subject to the following:

- 1. That the Village Board does hereby authorize the Northern Erie Sno-Seekers, Inc., to use the Bike Path beginning at Cedar Street and running southwest to Clarence Center Road, along a route that shall be specifically marked out by the Northern Erie Sno-Seekers, Inc., and approved by the Village of Akron Superintendent of Public Works,
 - a. The Northern Erie Sno-Seekers must provide the Village with proof of liability coverage naming the Village of Akron as additional insured in an amount satisfactory to the Village. If such coverage is part of a blanket coverage for all snowmobile clubs throughout the State of New York, the Village of Akron must be specifically named as an additional insured on such policy.
 - b. The Northern Erie Sno-Seekers must provide the Village with an updated copy of its certificate of incorporation and by-laws and of its rules and regulations for operation of snowmobiles on trails maintained by them.
 - c. The Northern Erie Sno-seekers will provide to the Village an indemnification agreement holding the Village harmless and defending the Village from all property damages and personal injuries occasioned by the activities of the Northern Erie Sno-Seekers, their members, agents, invitees or employees on any Village lands during the term of the agreement to use the Bike Path.
 - d. The use of the right-of-way shall begin on the last day of deer hunting season and shall terminate on April 1, 2010.
 - e. The Northern Erie Sno-Seekers, Inc. must cooperate with the Village to clearly mark the trail, which trail shall be located off the paved portions of the Bike Path and post speed limits and rules and regulations governing the use of the trails, satisfactory to the Village.
 - f. The Northern Erie Sno-Seekers, Inc., shall use the Bike Path in a manner that allows for the use of the same facilities by others including hikers and cross country skiers.
 - g. The Northern Erie Sno-Seekers, Inc. shall use their best efforts to avoid damage to Village Property, injury to individuals, or excessive noise.
 - h. Failure to abide by all these conditions may result in the Village Board's withdrawal or rescinding of the consent of the Village to use the Bike Path.
- 2. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

PUBLIC COMMENT – Resident Doug Ceisner asked the Code Enforcement Officer why 56 Main Street needed a permit to replace less than 50% of the windows in the building when the 99 Main Street property owner did not need a permit. Code Enforcement Officer Don Folger stated that the property owner at 56 Main Street came in on his own and stated that he would be replacing more windows in the future. Mr. Ceisner also questioned the Board regarding the cost of VRI Environmental Services. Clerk-Treasurer Borchert responded that VRI Environmental Services receives about \$80,000 per year for managing the Sewer Plant. Many of the sewer projects and upgrades recently done were completed with the help of an EPA grant.

Resident Walter Nelson came before the Board to discuss the bike path use during the winter months. Mr. Nelson stated that the snowmobile's use of the path prohibits snow shoeing, cross-country skiing and other quiet activities. Mayor Patterson responded that the Sno-Seekers Club puts barrels on the paved path so the snowmobiles ride on the side of the path leaving room for other activities.

PROJECT REPORTS -

State Street Bridge – Village Engineer Paul Bowers stated during this evenings work session that he received a letter from NYDOT stating that the State Street bridge is on the list for funding from the government where 80% of the cost would be covered by Federal and State funds and 20% would be the responsibility of the municipality. Mr. Bowers also received a letter from NYDEC stating that there are no permits needed to complete the bridge project.

Joint Facility – During this evenings work session Public Works employee Jon Cummings gave the Board an update on the Joint Facility site. Also Mayor Patterson reported that a Joint Facility progress meeting was held last week and discussion of the next steps and utilities were covered. On the recommendation of Village Attorney Daniel D. Shonn, the Board should authorize Mayor Patterson to sign the Sanitary Sewer Easements with property owners Akron Development LLC (T.A. No. 47.18-1-34.111) and John R. Davis (T.A. No. 47.18-1-30.12) of Clarence Center Road.

Departments -

Attorney – absent

<u>Clerk-Treasurer</u> – The Board received the Clerk's report for November 2009, together with the December 2009 office schedule. Clerk-Treasurer Borchert reminded the Board that the Village Office will be closed December 25, 2009 and January 1, 2010.

<u>Chief of Police</u> – The Board received the Police Report for November 2009, along with a schedule for December 2009. Chief Lauricella reported that: traffic summons are up this month, winter parking warnings have been given and summons will now be issued, an increase in auto break-ins have occurred again and Chief Lauricella will continue to urge residents to keep their vehicles locked, and lastly that the Akron Central School winter sport schedule has begun.

<u>Supt. of Public Works</u> – The Board received copies of Superintendent Kowalik's November 2009 report. Superintendent Kowalik reported on the site work for the Joint Facility on Clarence Center Rd, the collection of leaves and the fact that there were a lot

more collected this year meaning the trees have recovered from the 2006 October Storm, the Christmas tree has been secured and will be put up at the end of this week, he reported the damage done in Russell Park where railings were knocked out of the gazebo and lights were broken in the shelter. Superintendent Kowalik and Clerk-Treasurer Borchert spent several hours watching the park video to retrieve any information regarding the damage but have not found anything yet. Lastly, Mr. Kowalik spoke about the NYS requirements regarding Class A & B renewal licenses for employees at the Public Works facility.

Trustee Forrestel commented on how successful the leave pickup was this year. Job well done.

<u>Code Enforcement Officer</u> – Mr. Folger reported that he sent out a Fireworks Application to Young Explosives for the New Years Eve Celebration, reported a house on Brooklyn Street is to be demolished and the Village does not have a permit for demolition, The Akron House has a new tenant and would like to open by the end of the year, only have 4 Rental Regulation Applications still outstanding, discussed the new Plumber License Law and lastly is in receipt of the Town of Newstead Local Laws #5, #6 and #7 regarding amendments to Zoning Laws.

<u>VRI – Environmental Services</u> – Representative Al Graham was due to report on the Sewer Plant but had to leave unexpectedly leaving Trustee Forrestel to update the Board as follows: things are running well at the Sewer Plant. Camera work is still being done on the north east side of the Village, the additional drying bed added this year has really improved the operations resulting in no sludge removal thus far, lastly Trustee Forrestel circulated pictures to the Board of the upgrades and improvements done this year at the plant.

Trustee Forrestel – Attended the WWWC meeting where discussion was held regarding the extension of the Sewer Moratorium. The committee recommended extending the Moratorium with 50 units until June 30, 2010.

Background:

At a meeting of the Village Board on December 7, 2009, the Village Board extended the moratorium originally adopted as Local Law 2005-1 to June 30, 2010. Based on the discussions with the New York State DEC and in the opinion of representatives of VRI Environmental Services, operators of the treatment plant, the Board has amended on this date, the original moratorium to include the equivalent of fifty (50) residential units on a rolling basis so long as the waste water treatment plant remains in compliance with DEC permits. The Board has reviewed the monthly operation reports provided by VRI and finds that there continues to be significant improvement in plant performance. These reports also show there are concerns with continuing compliance in high inflow events and that the Village continues to improve on reducing infiltration by grouting and smoke testing.
