WHEREAS, the Alden Town Board has noticed the need to add railing near the building and parking lot at the Town of Alden Senior/Community Center, the estimated cost of which is more than \$2,000.00 but less than \$20,000

WHEREAS, the Procurement Policy & Procedure Guidelines of the Town of Alden states that the Town must obtain written quotes from at least three(3) vendors;

WHEREAS, said Procurement Policy & Procedure Guidelines have followed and quotes have been properly received;

WHEREAS, the Town Board after full and careful review and consideration of the need finds that it is in the public interest to authorize said the installation of the railings:

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The town Board approves the installation of railings at the Town of Alden Senior/Community Center, by Pro-Fab Manufacturing, Inc. for a total cost of \$3,766.50 as per the attached specifications;
- 2. That the Supervisor of the Town of Alden is authorized to sign any and all necessary documents to effectuate this installation;
- 3. That the Installation shall be completed within 45 days of this resolution; and
- 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Alden is considering an application by Christine M. Schmidt for the subdivision of one (1) lot. The entire parcel currently consists of 25 +/- acres of land with a residence, pond and outbuildings at 11862 Westwood Road in the Town of Alden, further identified as SBL #107.00-3-8.1. The first proposed lot "Parcel A") would be a 22 +/- acre vacant parcel and the second proposed lot ("Parcel "B") would be the remaining 3 +/- acre parcel with the residence, pond and outbuildings (The "Proposed Action");

WHEREAS, the Town board has determined that the Proposed Action is an Unlisted Action under SEQRA but has determined that it is in the public interest to conduct a coordinated review;

WHEREAS, the Town Board believes that the Town of Alden is: the agency primarily responsible for undertaking decisions as to subdivision; the agency with the broadest governmental powers for investigating the impact of the Proposed Action; has the greatest capacity for providing the most thorough environmental assessment of the Proposed Action; and is the most local agent with permitting authority;

WHEREAS, the Town Building Inspector has provided notice to the Erie County Division of Planning for this Proposed Action, as required under Section 239-M of the General Municipal Law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The Town Board has determined that the Proposed Action is an Unlisted Action under SEQRA
- 2. The town Board has determined that it should be the Lead Agency for all environmental review of the Proposed Action; and
- 3. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

The above resolution was duly put to roll call vote at a regular meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Alden on September 8, 2009 and was unanimously adopted.

Councilman Snyder moved and Councilwoman Cooke seconded the Motion to grant The Alden Garden Club permission to use the Community Center on requested dates. Unanimously carried.

Councilwoman Cooke moved and Councilman Snyder seconded the Motion to grant The Alden Historical Society permission to use the Community Center on requested dates. Unanimously carried.

THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WAS OFFERED BY COUNCILWOMAN RIDDOCH WHO MOVED ITS ADOPTION, SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN SNYDER TO WIT:

WHEREAS, the State of New York Commissioner of Transportation on July 16, 1998, commenced a proceeding pursuant to Section 95 of the Railroad Law, seeking a determination as to whether the at-grade rail crossing of Reinhardt Road in the Town of Alden, over the tracks of the Chicago Line of CSX Transportation, Inc. ("crossing"), be closed and discontinued;

WHEREAS, said Crossing was ordered closed on October 22, 1999, with an affirmative Order having been filed on April 13, 2001;

WHEREAS, in November, 2008, the New York State Department of Transportation ("NYSDOT") reopened the matter to request that an Administrative Law Judge set a deadline for the closure of said Crossing;

WHEREAS, after a hearing on February 4, 2009; a NYSDOT Administrative Law Judge on June 18, 2009 ordered that the Crossing closure occur by December 1, 2009;

WHEREAS, the NYSDOT has agreed to build cul-de-sacs on each side of the Crossing;

WHEREAS, Road Closure signs have been placed by the NYSDOT and the NYSDOT has commenced construction to effectuate the Crossing closure and build the cul-de-sacs.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT;

- 1. The Town of Alden hereby issues a Public Improvement Permit to the NYSDOT, for the construction of two cul-de-sacs (one on each side of the Crossing);
- 2. During the construction period the Town of Alden demands that the NYSDOT continue working with Erie County Department of Public Works regarding the modifications to the railroad crossing at Peters Corners Road;
- 3. The Town of Alden will not accept the Dedication from NYSDOT of the new cul-desacs and the NYSDOT shall remain liable for the maintenance and repair of the same unless and until
- a. The Town of Alden is satisfied with the title to the property and has approved the proposed Quit Claim Deed;
- b. An Intermunicipal Agreement satisfactory to the Town is provided by the NYSDOT;
- c. A Pipeline Agreement satisfactory to the Town is provided by CSX Transportation for the Town's existing water line; and
- d. The Town Engineer is satisfied with the construction of the cul-de-sacs; and
- e. The crossing at Peters Corners Road is modified by NYSDOT and Erie County DPW to the satisfaction of the Town; and
- 4. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

The adoption of the foregoing Resolution was duly put to a roll call vote on September 8, 2009 and was unanimously adopted.

Councilman Weber moved and Councilwoman Riddoch seconded the Motion to grant VFW Post #7967 permission to use the Community Center on requested dates. Unanimously carried.

THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WAS OFFERED BY COUNCILMAN SNYDER, WHO MOVED ITS ADOPTION, SECONDED BY COUNCILWOMAN COOKE TO WIT;

WHEREAS, the Town of Alden Parks Supervisor has advised the Town Board that the Parks Department is in need of baseball sand for the Town's baseball and softball diamonds the estimated cost of which is over \$500.00;

WHEREAS, the Procurement Policy & Procedure Guidelines of the Town of Alden ("Policy") requires that all estimated purchases of over \$500.00 but less than \$2,000.01 require a request for a proposal and written quotes from at least two (2) vendors;

WHEREAS, said Policy has been followed and three (3) quotes have been obtained; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board after full and careful review and consideration of the purchase request finds the purchase in the public interest.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. That the Town Board approves the purchase of forty-eight (48) yards of red infield mix, to be picked up by the Town of Alden, from Leo F. Malloy Topsoil, Inc. for a price of \$45.00 per yard (which equals \$720.00 per load of 16 yards)at a total price of \$2,160.00 as being consistent with its policies and in the interests of the residents of the Town of Alden
- 2. That the Supervisor of the Town of Alden is authorized to sign any and all necessary documents to effectuate this purchase; and
- 3. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
