Team has also presented to the Planning Board. Is in attendance to introduce themselves to the Town Board. Copart has multiple sites, including another location in Erie County in Evans. Copart acquires inoperable vehicles and lists them on their auction site for purchase. Planning Board questioned the location of the fence noting it was not at the current code for the setback. Copart would like to leave the fence location as is but will put up a white plank fence that is visually appealing. CEO Snyder will look into the question on the fence set back; there is also a house on the property to take into consideration. Jennifer Strong added the public hearing will be held on December 1st.

Colleen Rogers, Deputy Town Supervisor

Chamber of Commerce is requesting use of the Park for their Christmas in the Park on December 12th. There is concern over the “zones” and if a drive-thru would be a possibility if the Town is in a zone that doesn’t allow for gatherings.

The Substance Abuse Coalition and the Parks employees have been working hard on getting lights up in the Park. In addition to the \$2,000 the Board has already approved for the coalition’s decorations they are requesting \$500 more for decorations. Supervisor Adamski stated he didn’t have a problem with that as it is something everyone can enjoy. He also noted how much people

enjoyed their haunted walking path. Colleen Rogers went on to add that currently the park closes at dusk, so park hours will need to be changed to allow people to see the lights.

Cayuga Creek letters went out. Residents have until the 20th to get their petitions in.

On 11/17 there will be a site review for our CDBG Grant.
