# THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WAS OFFERED BY SUPERVISOR SITZMAN, WHO MOVED ITS ADOPTION, SECONDED BY COUNCILWOMAN PAUTLER, TO WIT;

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Alden is considering an application, by Zoladz Construction Company Inc. for site plan approval of two proposed storage buildings at the northeast corner of Broadway and Two Rod Road (now known as 11668 Broadway), in the Town of Alden, further identified by SBL # 118.00-2-13.2; 118.00-2-14.12; and 118.00-2-14.11 (The "Proposed Action");

WHEREAS, the Alden Town Board has determined that the Proposed Action is an Unlisted Action under SEQRA and has conducted a coordinated review;

WHEREAS, the Alden Town Board believes that this Board: is the agency primarily responsible for undertaking decisions as to site plan review; is the agency with the broadest governmental powers for investigating the impact of the proposed action; has the greatest capacity for providing the most thorough environmental assessment of the proposed action; and is the most local agent with permitting authority;

WHEREAS, the Town of Alden has provided notice to Erie County Planning as required under Section 239-m of the General Municipal Law; WHEREAS, the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act requires the Town Board to determine the Lead Agency status and the Lead Agency making a SEQR determination;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article 8 of the Environmental Conservation Law, the SEQRA Intake Officer has prepared the Short Environmental Assessment Form, which is now on file with the Town Board;

WHEREAS, any comments received from the involved agencies have been fully addressed by the SEQRA Intake Officer;

WHEREAS, during review of this Proposed Action, the Town of Alden assessed areas of environmental concern, and determined that no significant negative impacts would occur. In reaching this decision, the Town carefully considered all "Criteria" for Determination of Significance listed in the SEQRA Regulations; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Alden Planning Board and the Town Engineer have recommended the approval of the site plan.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS THAT:

1. The Town Board has determined that the Proposed Action is an Unlisted Action under SEQRA; that a proper coordinated review has been conducted; and that the Town of Alden should be the lead agency for all environmental review of the Proposed Action;

2. The Town of Alden, as Lead Agency hereby concludes that the project will not adversely affect the natural resources of the State and/or the health, safety and welfare of the public and is consistent with social and economic consideration; and that the project will not have a significant effect on the environment and that an environmental impact statement is not required to be prepared with respect to said Proposed Action;

3. The Town Board finds that the Proposed Action is consistent with the Town Code and the Town Comprehensive Plan and approves the site plan; and

4. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

WHEREAS, Greatbatch Ltd. / Integer (hereinafter "Applicant") filed a Site Plan Application on July 6, 2021 for real property commonly referred to as 11870 Walden Avenue (SBL No. 96.00-3-44.111); and

**WHEREAS**, on July 12, 2021, the Town of Alden Planning Board unanimously recommended approval of the site plan to the Alden Town Board; and

**WHEREAS**, on July 12, 2021, the Town of Alden Planning Board unanimously recommended approval of the site plan to the Alden Town Board; and

WHEREAS, on July 20, 2021, the Alden Town Board approved the Rezoning of the Property by removing a portion of said property from the R-2 Residential District and R-A Rural-Agricultural District Zoning District and adding said portion of real property commonly referred to as 0 Walden Avenue (SBL No. 96.00-3-44.111) to the M-1 Manufacturing District and the Town Board issued a Negative Declaration pursuant to the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act; and

WHEREAS, on August 10, 2021, Local Law No. 2 of 2021 which enacted the aforesaid Rezoning was filed with the New York State Department of State; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town Engineer approved the engineered plans subject to the Applicant being granted area variances from the Town of Alden Zoning Board of Appeals and approval from Erie County of the Applicant's application to become an out of district sewer customer; and

**WHEREAS**, on January 12, 2022, Town of Alden Zoning Board of Appeals unanimously approved the Applicant's application for area variances; and

WHEREAS, on January 20, 2022, the Town Engineer was provided documentation that Erie County had approved the Applicant's application to become an out of district sewer customer; and

WHEREAS, all legal requirements, including compliance with New York State General Municipal Law § 239-m.

**Now Therefore Be IT Resolved by THE ALDEN TOWN BOARD** has made the following required findings regarding the aforesaid Site Plan Application:

A. The Site Plan is in compliance with the Town Zoning Code and is compatible with the Town Master Plan.

B. The location, arrangement, size, design and general site compatibility of buildings, lighting and signs are adequate and meet the provisions of the Town Zoning Code.

C. The location, arrangement, appearance and of off-street parking and loading are sufficient.

D. The arrangement of pedestrian traffic access and circulation, walkway structures, control of intersections with vehicular traffic and overall pedestrian convenience is adequate.

E. Stormwater, drainage facilities and water supply and sewage disposal facilities are adequate.

F. The type and arrangement of trees, shrubs and other landscaping constituting a visual and/or noise buffer between the applicant's and adjoining lands, including the maximum retention of existing vegetation, are adequate.

G. The fire lanes and other emergency zones and the provision of fire hydrants are adequate.

H. Any impact of structures, roadways and landscaping in areas with susceptibility to ponding, flooding and/or erosion has been adequately addressed in the Site Plan.

I. The overall impact on the neighborhood, including compatibility of design considerations, is adequate; and
