BUSINESS FROM THE FLOOR

Supervisor Pautler- Addressed the room before opening to Business from the Floor, Supervisor Pautler announced that the Code Enforcement Officer, Rick Coburn, is here to give an update first, after the update from Mr. Weber's property.

Code Enforcement Officer, Rick Coburn: Myself, Councilmembers, Mark Kerl and Mark Drogi went to meet with Mr. Webbers' lawyers on Sunday at his property, the lawyers did not show. Mr. Webber was very agitated. Mr. Webber did not allow us entry and stated we were trespassing. Mr. Webber did start removing cars. My office sent out the RFP's last week to businesses that would be interested in removing the vehicles from the outside of the property. The vehicles inside the building are a separate court order. Our town prosecutor, Ralph Mohr did send a letter to his attorneys, we are hoping to be able to go back to the property tomorrow if not Wednesday before his court date on Thursday and that everyone will be able to attend that meeting, we will also have law enforcement with us, Ralph Mohr has requested that any time we attend his property we have two law enforcement individuals accompanying us. We are starting to work on an RFP for the inside of the building. Mr. Webber cannot keep me as the Code Enforcement Officer off his property. We cannot do anything else until the next court date on Thursday, July 23rd. We can only follow what the current court order is. We will be informing the Court on Thursday what transpired on Sunday the 19th. We

are hoping to award the first RFP bid on August 3rd. We will have more information after his court date on Thursday, July 23rd.

Councilmember Kerl- Mr. Webber was very agitated when we were at the property on 7/19/2026, we decided it was best to leave the premises.

Attorney Strong- Mr. Webber has Court downtown on Thursday, July 23rd. We will make sure to bring everything with us to that court date. To answer Debbie S' question, we do not know what will happen at court on Thursday, many things could happen, he could be fined or put in jail given an extension, we do not know what the judge will decide.

Debbie Szajta 11115 W. Alaura Drive- What can happen on Thursday when he is in court. If you award the bid and he starts removing cars, how will that affect the bidder?

Lynn Baker 907 Alaura Drive- Can Mr. Webber keep you off his property? Tomorrow he is in Alden Court, what will or can they hold against him in Alden Court?

Denise Walczak 478 W. Alaura Drive- Did the EPA rep say anything about the condition of his property? How can he deny a court order? Do you think his lawyers did not show up on purpose?

Paul Baker 907 Alaura Drive- Do we know if there is a rodent problem? Has anything been done about this yet?

Carol Rice 968 W. Alaura Drive- Will you be taking a police force with you when you go to Mr. Webbers property?

WHEREAS, the Alden Town Board is considering an application by MillGen LLC/Matt Stucke) on behalf of Clark and Lois Bono for the subdivision of two lots. **RESOLUTION DECLARING SEQRA NEGATIVE DECLARATION AND APPROVING MINOR
SUBDIVISION AT 11660 WALDEN AVENUE**

THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WAS OFFERED BY SUPERVISOR COLLEEN PAUTLER, WHO
MOVED ITS ADOPTION, SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER GWENDOLYN BORK

**WHEREAS, the Alden Town Board is considering an application by Tim Burden for the
subdivision of two lots. The entire property currently consists of approximately 12.44 acres of vacant
land at 11660 Walden Avenue, in the Town of Alden, further identified as SBL# 96.00-2-19.11. The
first proposed lot ("Parcel A") will be approximately 7.26 acres and the second proposed lot ("Parcel
B") will be approximately 4.99 acres (The "Proposed Action");**

WHEREAS, the Proposed Action is an unlisted action within the requirements of the
New York State Environmental Quality Review Act;

WHEREAS, the Town Building Inspector provided notice to the Erie County Division of Planning,
for this Proposed Action, as required under Section 239-m of the General Municipal Law and no comment
was received;

WHEREAS, the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act requires the Town
to determine the Lead Agency status and the Lead Agency making a SEQRA determination;

WHEREAS, the Alden Town Board did assume Lead Agency Status on June 2, 2025;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article 8 of the Environmental Conservation Law the Town
Board has prepared the Short Form Environmental Assessment Form, which is now on file with
the Town Board and the Town's SEQRA Intake Officer; and

WHEREAS, during review of this Proposed Action, the Town of Alden assessed areas of
environmental concern and determined that no significant negative impacts would occur. In
reaching this decision, the Town carefully considered all "Criteria" for Determination
of Significance listed in the SEQRA Regulations.

**WHEREAS, the Town of Alden Planning Board on May 13, 2025, reviewed the Proposed
Action and recommended to the Town Board the approval of the Proposed
Action.**

**WHEREAS, the Town of Alden Zoning Board of Appeals granted a variance for setback
requirements on September 26, 2025.**

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS THAT:

**The Town Board, as Lead Agency, has determined that the Proposed Action is an Unlisted Action
under SEQRA;**

This notice is issued pursuant to Part 617 of the implementing regulations pertaining to Article 8 (State Environmental Conservation Law (State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA"))).

The Town of Alden Town Board ("Board"), as lead agency, has determined the project submitted on behalf of Timothy Burden, located at 11660 Walden Street (SBL No. 96.00-2-19.11) will not have a significant adverse environmental impact and a Draft Environmental Impact Statement will not be prepared.

Name of Action: Timothy Burden

Location of Action: 11660 Walden Street, (SBL No. 96.00-2-19.11) Alden New York

SEOR Status: Unlisted

Description of Action: Separation of Parcel at 11660 Walden Avenue. To create subdivision of the parcel into two lots, Lot 1 would be 7.26 AC and Lot 2 - 4.99 AC. Lots to be used for single family home building. The zoning is R-3.

Local Law No. 5 of 2026 Town of Alden, County of Erie Title: Override of Tax Cap

BE IT ENACTED BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF ALDEN, COUNTY OF ERIE AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION ONE Legislative Intent

The State Constitution, Article XVI, §1, reserves all taxing power to the State and therefore local governments possess only that taxing power which has been expressly delegated to them by the State Legislature (Opns St Comp, 1990 No. 90-39; Opns St Comp, 1981, No. 81-331; Opns St Comp, 1973, No. 72-1085, unreported; 23 Opns St Comp, 1967, p 788).

The Town Board of the Town of Alden, County of Erie has reviewed the financial needs and obligations of the town. Due to contract obligations, limited revenue from non-real property tax sources, the rising cost of commodities and health care, compliance with unfunded mandates, reductions in state and federal revenue sharing programs coupled with the limitations on raising revenue set forth in General Municipal Law, §3-c, the Town Board of the Town of Alden, County of Erie, hereby determines that it necessary to override the tax cap for the fiscal year 2027.

SECTION TWO Authority

General Municipal Law, §3-c (5) authorizes the town board to adopt a local law overriding the tax cap by the adoption of a local law approved by vote of sixty percent (60%) of the town board.

SECTION THREE Tax Cap Override

The Town Board of the Town of Alden, County of Erie hereby overrides the tax cap as required by General Municipal Law, §3-c as for the town fiscal year of 2027.

SECTION FOUR. Severability.

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this Local Law or the application thereof to any person, firm or corporation, or circumstance, shall be adjusted by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order or judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this Local Law or in its application to the person, individual, firm or corporation or circumstance, directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment or order shall be rendered.

SECTION FIVE. Effective date.

This local law take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.
