

LOCAL LAW No. 21 - 1973

A local law amending local law number one—nineteen hundred sixty, as amended, constituting the Erie county administrative code by adding to article five, section 5.05, subsection (b), the requirement that notice of public hearing of amendment to sanitary code be furnished to the clerk of each city, town and village in Erie county.

Became a law with the approval of the county executive, December 19, 1973. Passed by the local legislative body of the county of Erie. Filed in the office of the secretary of state December 26, 1973.

*Be it enacted by the legislature of the county of Erie as follows:*

Section 1. Amendment to Erie county administrative code. Article five, section 5.05, subsection (b) of local law number one—nineteen hundred sixty, constituting the Erie county administrative code is amended to read as follows:

b. Any sanitary code now in force or hereafter adopted by the board of health pursuant to the provisions of section five hundred four of article V of the county charter and any amendment to such sanitary code shall be published and filed in the manner and places required by the Public Health Law and any other applicable law. Before adopting any amendment to the county sanitary code the board of health shall cause notice of a public hearing thereon to be published in the official newspapers once a week for two publications and at least twenty days shall elapse from the first publication to the date of the hearing. The notice shall contain an abstract statement of the proposed amendment and give the time and place of such hearing. On or before the date of the first publication of the proposed amendment, copies thereof shall be filed with the clerk of the county legislature, the county executive, the clerk of each city, town and village in Erie county and in the office of the commissioner of health and be open to inspection by the public. Such county sanitary code and any amendments thereto shall also be filed in the Erie county clerk's office.

§ 2. Effective date. This local law shall be effective immediately.
