A LOCAL LAW amending Local Law No. 1 - 1959, constituting the Erie County Charter, amending § 103 thereof to substitute the words New York State Municipal Home Rule Law for the words article 6-A of the County Law inasmuch as article 6-A of the County Law has been repealed by the New York State Municipal Home Rule Law.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE ERIE COUNTY LEGISLATURE, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Purpose. Section 103 of the Erie County Charter presently provides that "Within the limits prescribed in article six-A of the County Law, wherever and whenever any state law, general, special or local in effect, is inconsistent with this charter, such law shall be deemed to the extent of such inconsistency to be superseded by this charter insofar as the county of Erie and its government are affected."

It is noted, however, that article 6-A of the County Law was repealed by the Municipal Home Rule Law, effective January 1, 1964. Consequently, § 103 of the Charter is being updated by substituting the words New York State Municipal Home Rule Law for the words article six-A of the County Law.

Section 2. Section 103 of Local Law No. 1 - 1959, constituting the Erie County Charter, is amended to read as follows:

§ 103. Charter effect on state laws. Within the limits prescribed in (article six-A of the County Law,) the New York State Municipal Home Rule Law, wherever and whenever any state law, general, special or local in effect, is inconsistent with this charter, such law shall be deemed to the extent of such inconsistency to be superseded by this charter insofar as the county of Erie and its government are affected.

Section 3. Effective date. This local law shall be effective immediately.
