WHEREAS, both the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) and the NYS Department of Economic Development, Empire State Development's Environmental Management Investment Group (EMIG) provide grant assistance to municipalities and not-for-profit corporations to implement projects to increase waste recycling; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Environment and Planning provides technical assistance to municipalities and businesses to help address their waste management needs; and

WHEREAS, construction and demolition waste was identified as a targeted waste stream by the Town of Amherst, the Northwest Communities Solid Waste Management Board, and the Northeast Southtowns Solid Waste Management Board in their New York State approved Solid Waste Management Plans; and

WHEREAS, on November 4, 1999, this Legislative Body passed a resolution (Comm. 19E-28) authorizing the County Executive to enter into the necessary agreement with USEPA to accept \$36,250 in grant resources to support a solid waste management assistance project and assist municipalities in developing markets for construction and demolition waste; and

WHEREAS, on April 6,2000, this Legislative Body passed a resolution (Comm. 6E-28) authorizing the County Executive to enter into the necessary agreement with the NYS Department of Economic Development, Empire State Development's Environmental Management Investment Group (EMIG) to accept a \$70,000 grant to continue and expand the County Solid Waste Management Assistance Project; and

WHEREAS, on July 13, 2001, this Legislative Body passed a resolution (Comm. 15E-15) authorizing the County Executive to enter into the necessary agreement with USEPA to accept an additional \$29,900 in grant resources to continue to expand the Solid Waste Management Assistance Project and specifically develop a City of Buffalo Deconstruction Pilot program; and

WHEREAS, the use of the Buffalo Architectural Salvage Committee of the Allentown Association, Inc., to implement the City of Buffalo Deconstruction project will provide the technical expertise necessary to determine whether buildings scheduled for demolition have architectural significance and are appropriate candidates for deconstruction; and

WHEREAS, through Legislative authorization, provided by a resolution (Comm. 6E-21) dated April 13, 2000, the Department of Environment and Planning has accepted this role and successfully coordinated the Rebuild Partnership in Western New York; and

WHEREAS, the realignment of position will enable the County to redirect the existing grant resources to effectively accomplish the original objectives of the grant contract, and enable a current employee to transfer from a grant position where funding is about to expire to a completely funded NYSERDA grant.
