COUNTY EXECUTIVE

WHEREAS, the Erie County Department of Senior Services has been functioning with an acting commissioner (the Commissioner of Mental Health) since January 1, 2012; and

WHEREAS, the County Executive wishes to appoint a new commissioner with significant governmental, private sector and non-profit experience to oversee this department which performs vital services to our senior citizens; and

WHEREAS, the salary for the position of Commissioner of Senior Services is budgeted for 2012 at job group 17, step 5, with an annualized salary of \$91,466; and

WHEREAS, the administration wishes to fill the position with a talented candidate from outside of the county government at step 3, which is budget-neutral;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Erie County Legislature hereby authorizes a variable minimum for the position of Commissioner of Senior Services at job group 17, step 3 (\$82,416 annualized salary), in the Department of Senior Services; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Division of Budget and Management is hereby authorized to adjust the Adopted 2012 Budget of the Department of Senior Services for this position; and be it further

RESOLVED, that certified copies of this resolution will be forwarded to the County Executive, the Office of the Comptroller, the Department of Personnel, the Division of Budget and Management, and the Department of Senior Services.

3. COMM. 9E-21 (2012)

COUNTY EXECUTIVE

WHEREAS, the Erie County Legislature has already appropriated funds for the State Transportation (AAATRAN) grant for the period April 1, 2011 to March 31, 2012; and

WHEREAS, the Department contracts with the Center for Transportation Excellence (CTE) to provide wheelchair and other rides for frail elderly individuals ineligible for other transportation, and the contract amount needs to be increased to cover all such trips authorized by the Department; and

WHEREAS, the current CTE contract is for \$34,050 and is budgeted for in account #516020, Professional Service Contracts and Fees; and

WHEREAS, the AAATRAN1112 grant budget needs to be revised; and

WHEREAS, AAATRAN1112 is a 100% state funded program.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the County Executive is hereby authorized to increase the AAATRAN1112 contract with the Center for Transportation Excellence to \$44,322; and be it further

4. COMM. 9E-22 (2012)

COUNTY EXECUTIVE

WHEREAS, the Erie County Legislature has already appropriated funds for the AAATRAN grant for the period April 1, 2012 to March 31, 2013, and the FREEDOM grant for the period September 30, 2010 to September 29, 2013; and

WHEREAS, AAATRAN1213 is a 100% state funded program, and FREEDOM1013 is a 100% federal funded program; and

WHEREAS, increase demand for contracted wheelchair and other rides for frail elderly ineligible for other transportation, is expected to increase costs above what was initially budgeted for in both grants; and

WHEREAS, the department desires to continue contracting with the Center for Transportation Excellence and also contracting with Western New York Independent Living Inc. for wheelchair and other rides, thereby increasing flexibility and reducing costs; and

WHEREAS, \$27,687 in payroll and fringe benefit costs for the Senior Services' Senior Dispatcher, initially budgeted for in the AAATRAN1213 grant's account #916390 can be reclassified and remain in the department's III-B2012 grant and paid for from vacancy savings in III-B, thereby freeing up AAATRAN monies to pay for rides; and

WHEREAS, \$7,296 in payroll and fringe benefit costs for the Senior Services' Senior Dispatcher, initially budgeted for in the FREEDOM1013 grant's account #916390 can be reclassified and remain in the department's III-B2012 grant and paid for from vacancy savings in III-B, thereby freeing up FREEDOM1013 monies to pay for rides; and

WHEREAS, the AAATRAN1213 grant and FREEDOM1013 grant budgets need to be revised.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that subject to the availability of funding in the AAATRAN1213 & FREEDOM1013 grants, the County Executive is hereby authorized to enter into contracts and

amendments to these contracts with the Center for Transportation Excellence and Western New York Independent Living Inc. to provide wheelchair and other rides for frail elderly as part of the Senior Services Going Places Transportation Program, for the periods covered by the grants, in an aggregate amount not to exceed the amounts budgeted for in the grants' Professional Services Contracts and Fees account (#516020); and be it further

RESOLVED, that \$27,687 in Senior Dispatcher salary and fringe benefit costs initially budgeted for in the AAATRAN1213 grant be paid out of the IIIB-2012 grant; and be it further
