Re: Urging EC Department of Health to Adopt the Guidance Provided by the NYSDOH Regarding Waivers of the NYS Smoking Ban. (Intro. 2-4)

WHEREAS, during the summer of 2003, the NYS Legislature passed legislation, which was signed by Governor Pataki, banning smoking in most public places including restaurants, bars, bowling alleys and bingo parlors, and

WHEREAS, this legislation became effective on July 24, 2003, and

WHEREAS, in the intervening six (6) months various establishments, restaurants, bars, bowling alleys and bingo parlors, have seen a significant decrease in business or have closed altogether as a result of the smoking ban, and

WHEREAS, the legislation passed by NYS contained a provision which allowed County Departments of Health to provide for waivers from the law to businesses if certain specific conditions were present, and

WHEREAS, the conditions required under the legislation were if compliance would cause undue financial hardship to the business or if other factors existed that would render compliance unreasonable as long as the waiver adhered to the spirit of the smoking ban by limiting exposure to second-hand smoke, and

WHEREAS, in December 2003, the NYS DOH offered guidance to County Departments of Health for dealing with waiver applications, and

WHEREAS, a copy of the December 2003 guidance from the NYS DOH is attached for your information, and

WHEREAS, to date, the Erie County Department of Health has not issued any waivers to any establishment in Erie County nor has the Department delineated a policy for considering waiver applications, and

WHEREAS, nearly 200 establishments have applied to the EC Department of Health for a waiver from the smoking ban, and

WHEREAS, the EC Department of Health is in the process of considering its waiver procedures as a result of a court order, and

WHEREAS, the Department expects to release its waiver procedure by January 23, 2004, and

WHEREAS, on the January 9, 2004, the Erie County Legislature held three (3) public hearings regarding the waiver procedure and received various input from the public on the waiver procedure,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Erie County Legislature does hereby urge the EC Department of Health to adopt a fair and equitable waiver procedure as soon as possible to assist the businesses hurt under the smoking ban, and be it further

RESOLVED, that this Honorable Body does hereby urge the EC Department of Health to adopt the guidance provided by the NYS DOH regarding the granting of waivers of the smoking ban as the County's waiver procedure, and be it further

RESOLVED, that certified copies of this resolution be sent to County Executive Giambra, Health Commissioner Billittier, the NYS DOH and the Western New York delegation to the NYS Legislature.

RESOLUTION NO. 9

Re: Collective Bargaining Agreement Between CSEA, Local 1000 AFSCME, AFL-CIO, Erie Unit Local 815 & EC for Period 1/1/04 – 12/31/06.

WHEREAS, the County of Erie and the Civil; Service Employees Association, Inc., Local 1000 A.F.S.C.M.E., AFL-CIO, Erie Unit of Local 815 ("CSEA") have reached an agreement covering working conditions, including wages and fringe benefits, for those employees of Erie County who are members of the collective bargaining unit represented by the CSEA and who are employed in the divisions and departments of the County of Erie; and

WHEREAS, said agreement provides for a three-year contract for the period from January 1, 2004 through December 31, 2006, for the purposes of wages and health care negotiations;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the attached amendments to the January 1, 2000 through December 31, 2003 collective bargaining agreement between the County of Erie and the CSEA are hereby approved, except as otherwise specified and agreed to, and shall remain in full force and effect until December 31, 2006; and be it further

RESOLVED, that said benefits be extended to all eligible employees covered by said Agreement who are on the active payroll as of January 1, 2004, and that said benefits and salary schedules in percentage increases be extended to all eligible employees covered by said Agreement who are on the active payroll as of January 1, 2005; and be it further

RESOLVED, that effective January 1, 2004, the health insurance benefits negotiated in the collective bargaining agreement are amended to provide that eligible employees who retire after the effective period of the collective bargaining agreement and those eligible employees who retired on or after January 1, 2003 shall have a single provider for health insurance; and be it further

RESOLVED, that said insurance benefits be extended to all eligible employees covered by said Agreements who are on the active payroll after ratification of this agreement; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the health insurance benefits negotiated in these Agreements be extended to all eligible former employees who retired on or after January 1, 2003; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the County Executive be authorized to enact said Agreements; and be it further

RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTY OF ERIE, NEW YORK, AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF A GUARANTEE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COUNTY AND THE ERIE COUNTY MEDICAL CENTER CORPORATION PROVIDING FOR THE GUARANTEE OF OBLIGATIONS TO BE ISSUED BY SUCH CORPORATION IN AN AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$85,000,000 OUTSTANDING AT ANY TIME, TOGETHER WITH INTEREST THEREON, AND PROVIDING FOR THE GUARANTEE OF OBLIGATIONS TO BE INCURRED BY SUCH CORPORATION UNDER AN INTEREST RATE EXCHANGE AGREEMENT, TO FINANCE THE COSTS OF THE TRANSFER BY THE COUNTY OF CERTAIN FACILITIES AND OPERATIONS OF THE ERIE COUNTY MEDICAL CENTER NETWORK TO SUCH CORPORATION.

RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF ERIE, NEW YORK (by the affirmative vote of not less than two thirds of the voting strength of said Legislature), AS FOLLOWS:

WHEREAS, the Erie County Medical Center Corporation ("ECMCC") is a public benefit corporation authorized to issue its bonds and notes to finance the costs of transfer by Erie County (the "County") of the facilities and operations of the Erie County Medical Center Healthcare Network (the "Network") to ECMCC pursuant to applicable provisions of state law; and

WHEREAS, the County is authorized pursuant to applicable provisions of state law to lend its credit to or in aid of ECMCC for the purpose of providing health related facilities or hospital facilities, and for facilities incidental or appurtenant thereto; and

WHEREAS, the County expects to guarantee the payment of such ECMCC bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of the issuance of such bonds in accordance with the Memorandum of Understanding by and between the County and ECMCC dated as of December 23, 2003 (the "MOU"); and

WHEREAS, the County also expects to guarantee the payment of amounts required to be paid from time to time under an interest rate exchange agreement (sometimes otherwise called as an interest rate swap) entered into by ECMCC for the purpose of managing interest rate fluctuation risks associated with such of the ECMCC bonds bearing interest on a variable-rate basis (the "ECMCC Swap");

Section 1. Pursuant to the provisions of the Public Authorities Law, constituting Chapter 43-A of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (the "Law"), the County Executive and the County Comptroller are hereby authorized to execute and deliver a guarantee agreement between the County and ECMCC, in such form as they may approve (the "Guarantee Agreement"), providing for the pledge of the County's faith and credit to guarantee (a) payment of ECMCC bonds or any notes issued in anticipation of the issuance of such bonds, in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$85,000,000 outstanding at any time, together with interest thereon, to be issued by ECMCC to

finance the costs of the transfer by the County of certain facilities and operations of the Network to ECMCC in accordance with the MOU (the "ECMCC Bonds"), and (b) payment of all amounts required to be paid from time to time by ECMCC under the ECMCC Swap (provided, however, that such guarantee of payments under the ECMCC Swap shall only be executed and delivered if the payment obligations of ECMCC under the ECMCC Swap other than any termination payments that may become due thereunder are secured by an insurance policy or financial guaranty issued by a nationally recognized bond or financial guaranty insurance company).

- Section 3. Pursuant to the applicable provisions of any agreements to be entered into by the County and ECMCC, the County Attorney is hereby authorized to consent in writing to the subordination of the liens and security interests granted to the County in such agreements between the County and ECMCC to any lien granted to ECMCC bondholders or noteholders with respect to bonds or notes issued by ECMCC and not guaranteed by the County pursuant to the Guarantee Agreement.
- Section 4. The County Executive and the County Comptroller are hereby authorized to execute and deliver a continuing disclosure agreement, in such form as they may approve, with respect to information relating to the County and included in any offering documents distributed by underwriters in collection with the sale and issuance of the ECMCC Bonds.
- Section 5. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon approval by the County Executive.
