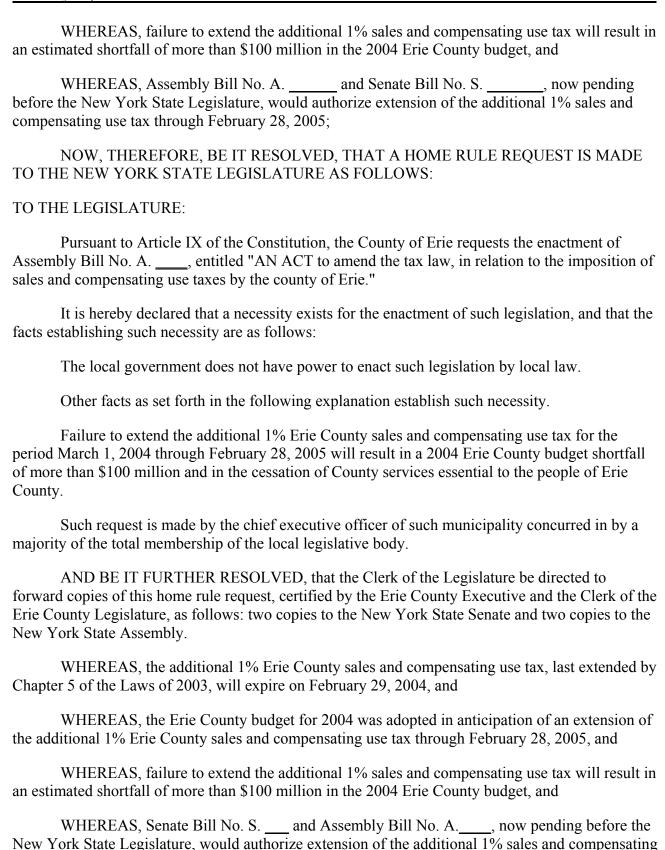

WHEREAS, the TOWN has requested that the COUNTY OF ERIE ("COUNTY") enter into a municipal cooperation agreement with the TOWN pursuant to General Municipal Law Article 5-G whereby the COUNTY is willing to provide such services through an employee or personal services

contractor of the Erie County Real Property Tax Service Office designated to act as the TOWN's sole assessor for the 2004 assessment year; and

WHEREAS, in consideration of the assessment services to be provided by the COUNTY hereunder, the TOWN agrees to pay the COUNTY the sum of \$26,100.00, which sum shall be paid to the COUNTY in four equal installments due on January 15, 2004, April 15, 2004, July 15, 2004, October 15, 2004; and

WHEREAS, in order to provide assessment services to the TOWN, the COUNTY shall engage the services of a New York State certified assessor and a New York State certified appraiser, both of whom have been selected pursuant to the RFP procedure found in § 19.08 of the Erie County Administrative Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Erie County Executive is authorized to enter into a municipal cooperation agreement with the TOWN wherein the COUNTY will provide assessment services to the TOWN for the 2004 assessment year; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Erie County Executive is authorized to enter into a personal services agreement with DAVID M. UNMACK, an independent contractor and New York State certified assessor, to assist the County in performing assessment services for the TOWN; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the COUNTY shall pay DAVID M. UNMACK for assessment services rendered hereunder the agreed rate of \$60.00 per hour, not to exceed a maximum aggregate of 385 hours (or \$23,100.00); and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Erie County Executive is authorized to enter into a personal services agreement with CHARLES L. SCHIFFLER, an independent contractor and New York State certified real property appraiser, to assist the County in performing assessment services for the TOWN; and be it further

RESOLVED, that COUNTY shall pay CHARLES L. SCHIFFLER the agreed rate of \$40.00 per hour, not to exceed a maximum aggregate of 50 hours (or \$2,000.00); and be it further

RESOLVED, that certified copies of this resolution be forwarded to the Erie County Executive, the Department of Law, the Erie County Real Property Tax Service Office, Division of Budget, Management and Finance, and the Office *of* the Comptroller.

Purchase and Operating Agreement; ("SPO

Agreement"): (ii) Ground Lease; and (iii) ancillary documents to facilitate the lease and/or transfer of Erie County Medical Healthcare Network ("ECMC") facilities and operating assets to Erie County Medical

Center Corporation ("ECMCC").

WHEREAS, pursuant to home rule requests from the Erie County Legislature, on July 22, 2003 the New York State Legislature enacted Title 6 of Article 10-C of the Public Authorities Law, which authorized the creation of the Erie County Medical Center Corporation ("ECMCC"), a public benefit corporation; and

WHEREAS, the County and ECMCC propose to enter into certain agreements to delineate each party's respective duties and obligations with regard to the creation and operation of such a public benefit corporation; and

WHEREAS, among the agreements that proposed to be executed between the County and ECMCC are: (a) a Ground Lease, wherein ECMCC will lease from the County the real property upon which the Erie County Medical Center ("ECMC") and the Erie County Home and Infirmary ("Home") are located (ECMC, the Home and ancillary facilities, collectively, shall hereinafter be known as the "ECMC Healthcare Network" or "ECMC Network"); and (b) a Sale, Purchase, and Operation Agreement ("SPO Agreement") which will provide (i) for ECMCC to purchase from the County certain buildings and other personal property located at ECMC, the Home and elsewhere: and (ii) after the effective date of the transfer of such assets to ECMCC as a public benefit corporation, how ECMCC as a public benefit corporation will be operated; and

WHEREAS, other related and ancillary agreements and documents may have to be executed between the County, ECMCC and others in order to effectuate the transformation of the ECMC Network into a public benefit corporation; and

WHEREAS, Section 6 of New York State General Municipal Law (GML) authorizes or in some cases requires municipal governing bodies to establish various types of reserve funds; and

WHEREAS, Section 6-1 of GML, in particular, mandates a municipal corporation to establish a reserve fund for the purpose of retiring obligations when the cash sale of a capital improvement occurs if: (i) the improvement was financed by the issuance of obligations; and (ii) all or part of such indebtedness is outstanding at the time of such sale; and

WHEREAS, as of the date of the sale of the ECMC Healthcare Network, \$20,212,780 of bonds remain outstanding

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the County Executive is hereby authorized to execute and deliver the Ground Lease and the SPO Agreement in substantially the form of the documents that are attached hereto; and be it further

RESOLVED, that prior to the County Executive's execution of the Ground Lease and the SPO Agreement, the County Attorney shall review same, and if necessary, approve of any modifications to said agreements that he deems necessary or appropriate to effectuate the transfer of the ECMC Network to ECMCC; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the County Executive is hereby authorized to execute such related and ancillary documents and agreements that the County Attorney deems necessary or appropriate for the transfer of the ECMC Network to ECMCC, subject to the review and approval of such documents by the County Attorney; and be it further
