# COUNTY OF ERIE LOCAL LAW INTRO. NO. 1 -2004 LOCAL LAW NO. \_\_\_\_ -2004

A LOCAL LAW, amending Local Law No. 2-2003, granting a partial exemption from real property taxation, pursuant to Section four hundred fifty-nine-c of the Real Property Tax Law, to persons with disabilities who have limited incomes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE ERIE COUNTY LEGISLATURE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section l(b) of Local Law No. 2-2003, granting a partial exemption from real property taxation, pursuant to Section four hundred fifty- nine-c of the Real Property Tax Law, to persons with disabilities who have limited incomes, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 1 (b). To be eligible for the exemption provided by subdivision one of this Local Law, the maximum income of such person shall not exceed twenty-four thousand dollars.

Real property owned by one or more persons with disabilities, or real property owned by a husband and wife, or both, or by siblings, at least one of whom has a disability, and whose income, as hereinafter defined, is limited by reason of such disability, shall be exempt from taxation by the County of Erie to the extent provided in the following table:

Section 2. This Local Law shall be effective immediately.

## COUNTY OF ERIE LOCAL LAW INTRO NO. 3- 2004 LOCAL LAW NO. -2004

A LOCAL LAW amending, Local Law No. 1-1959, constituting the Erie County Charter as amended, in relation to the re-establishment, restructuring and reconvening of the Erie County Charter Revision Commission.

# BE IT ENACTED BY THE ERIE COUNTY LEGISLATURE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. PURPOSE. Section 1907 of Article 19 of Local Law #1-1959 constituting the Erie County Charter, as amended, establishing a Charter Revision Commission is repealed, and a new Section 1907 hereby establishing a Charter Revision Commission for the year 2004 is established as a fully amending Section 1907 of the Erie County Charter.

Section 2. CHARTER REVISION COMMISSION. That upon the adoption of this Local Law the County Legislature hereby creates a Charter Revision Commission to be established on or before April 15, 2004.

Section 3. THE PURVIEW OF THE CHARTER REVISION COMMISSION. The Charter Revision Commission shall study the operations of the County of Erie in their full scope; and shall consider the inter-municipal relations of the County of Erie and the myriad responsibilities that the County of Erie discharges in the course of its broadly defined duties to determine whether the Erie County Charter and the Erie County Administrative Code shall be further amended to render same as an effective framework for County government, and to adopt such amendments as may be necessary to facilitate the delivery of services to the public and to better coordinate the functions between departments and agencies of the County and the various Cities, Towns and Villages within the County. The Charter Revision Commission shall submit a final report, which shall include its findings, conclusions, and recommendations for appropriate action to the County Legislature and the County Executive on or before the 15<sup>th</sup> day of April, 2005.

Section 4. METHODOLOGY OF OPERATION. The Commission shall be provided with adequate funding for staff and costs incident to the discharge of its responsibilities as may be deemed necessary by the Erie County Legislature in the furtherance of its assigned duties.

Section 5. MEMBERSHIP. The Charter Revision Commission shall be composed of 23 members with one (1) member to be appointed by each District Legislator of the Erie County Legislature. The County Executive of the County of Erie shall appoint three (3) members, and the

County Clerk, County Comptroller, County Sheriff, and the County District Attorney of the County of Erie shall have one appointee each to the Commission. In addition to the other designated appointment, the Chair of the Erie County legislature shall also appoint the Chairperson of the Charter Revision Commission.

No member of the Commission shall hold public office or be an employee of the County during the term of his/her appointment.

Section 6. REPORTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS. The County legislature shall act on all reports and recommendations submitted to it in a timely fashion by the Charter Revision Commission by either approving or disapproving each recommendation separately within three (3) months from the date of the submission of the findings, conclusions and report of the Commission.

WHEREAS, Buffalo Niagara Enterprise (BNE) is the business supported non- profit affiliate of the Buffalo/Niagara Partnership, created in 1999 by the private sector with the support of local government and Erie County to promote and foster job growth in this area, and

WHEREAS, the business community pledged to provide \$27 million in funding over five years in support of the BNE, and

WHEREAS, the BNE's original goal was the creation of 50,000 new net jobs over five years and \$1 billion in new investment in our area, and

WHEREAS, in support of the BNE's goals, Erie County provided \$950,000 in funding to BNE in October 1999, followed by \$1 million in 2001, \$1 million in 2002, \$1 million in 2003 and \$1 million in 2004, making Erie County the single-largest investor in the BNE, and

WHEREAS, the current County Executive has made Erie County financial support of the BNE a major priority, and

WHEREAS, acknowledging the organization's attempt to meet its goals, the BNE's board of directors voted in October 2001 to readjust the job goals altogether, and

WHEREAS, in April 2002, the BNE also significantly altered its national advertising and marketing campaign, putting less money and resources into national marketing and advertising, and more money into working one-on-one with local companies to encourage them to create more local jobs and pursue additional investment in the area, and

WHEREAS, the Erie County Industrial Development Agency (ECIDA) also plays a major role in the economic development efforts in Erie County,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Erie County Legislature requests the appearance of Randall Clark, Chairman of the BNE, and Thomas Kucharski, CEO and President of the BNE, and Kevin Clarke, Chairman of the ECIDA and Charles Webb, Executive Director of the ECIDA, at a future meeting of the Legislature's Economic Development Committee, in order that the Legislature may seek information, pose questions, and identify ways in which Erie County may be able to better work with the BNE and ECIDA in our mutual goal of creating new jobs, retaining existing jobs, and promoting new investment in Erie County, and be it further

WHEREAS, in order to guarantee this natural character and gain "Scenic Byway" status, U.S. Route 219 must first be designated by New York State, through its Department of Transportation, as a "Scenic Byway" under the National Scenic Byways Program, and

WHEREAS, once so designated and accepted by the federal government, U.S. Route 219 would be eligible for various federal improvements and assistance, including road design and redesign, safety features, highway management planning, tourism marketing, recreation opportunities, and the protection of adjacent areas from development, and

WHEREAS, "Scenic Byway" status would continue to foster the ongoing development of central and sub themes for the unique driving experience that U.S. Route 219 provides people,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

WHEREAS, a Public Hearing, pursuant to Section 467, paragraph l(a) of the State Real Property Tax Law, as amended, was duly advertised and held on \_\_\_\_\_\_ 2004 at 2:00 p.m. by the Erie County Legislature on the proposal to increase the maximum income eligibility level,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT
