WHEREAS, pursuant to proceedings heretofore had and taken in accordance with the provisions of Article 5-A of the County Law, including approving orders of the State Comptroller, County Sewer District No. 3 of the County of Erie, New York, has heretofore been established and created on April 9, 1963 (the "District") to provide sewer services to the Village of Orchard Park, most of the Town of Orchard Park, and parts of the Towns of West Seneca and Hamburg; and

WHEREAS, since the 1970s extensions to the District known as the Boston Valley, Armor-McKinley, Blasdell and Holland Extensions were formed; and

WHEREAS, the District and all extensions thereof were consolidated in 2003; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Managers of Erie County Sewer District No. 3 has duly directed that there be prepared a report and estimate of cost by the County Engineers (Erie County Department of Environment and Planning) relating to a proposed increase and improvement of the facilities of the District which report and estimate of cost have been approved by the Board of Managers of Erie County Sewer District No. 3 on December 10, 2003 and filed with the County Legislature pursuant to Section 268 of the County Law; and

WHEREAS, said report and estimate of cost describe a proposed increase and improvement of the facilities of the District, consisting of the reconstruction and/or replacement of approximately 24,500 linear feet of sewer, various pump station upgrades and reconstruction; and the installation and acquisition of process equipment, pumps, meters, controls, lab equipment, and plant reconstruction, as more fully described in the report and estimate of cost hereinbefore referred to; and WHEREAS, the maximum estimated cost of the aforesaid increase and improvement of the facilities of the District is \$5,000,000, to be apportioned among real properties in the District in accordance with (i) their respective proportionate shares of sewered units in the District, (ii) applicable flat charges, and (iii) assessments against a benefited area which consists of the entire area of said Sewer District No. 3; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 258 of the County Law, as amended by Chapter 397 of the Laws of 1995, the consent of the State Comptroller is not required prior to the construction of said increase and improvement of facilities of the District because the cost thereof to the Typical Property (as defined in the County Law) does not exceed the Average Estimated Cost to the Typical Properties for similar types of expenditures, as computed by the State Comptroller and such cost is \$8.00 for the Town of Hamburg, \$9.35 for the Town of Orchard Park, \$8.40 for the Town of West Seneca, \$6.40 for the Town of Holland, \$9.98 for the Town of Elma, \$9.00 for the Town of Boston, and \$8.55 for the Town of Eden; and

WHEREAS, said County Legislature duly adopted Resolution No.<u>76</u> on <u>March 4</u>, 2004, calling a meeting of the County Legislature for the purpose of holding a public hearing on said increase and improvement of facilities in accordance with said report and estimate of cost; and

WHEREAS, such Resolution authorized and directed the Clerk of said County Legislature to publish the notice of public hearing and file a certified copy of such notice with the office of the State Comptroller; and

WHEREAS, said public hearing was duly held at <u>92 Franklin Street, 2nd Floor, Part 6</u> in Buffalo, New York, in said County, on <u>April 1</u>, 2004, at <u>1:30</u> o'clock P.M., Prevailing Time; and

WHEREAS, notice of said public hearing was duly published and filed in the manner provided by law and proof thereof was submitted to said County Legislature; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to proceedings had and taken in accordance with the provisions of Article 5A of the County Law and more particularly a resolution of this County Legislature dated <u>April 28</u>, 2004, an increase and improvement of facilities for Sewer District No. 3 has been approved at a estimated maximum cost of \$5,000,000, and

WHEREAS, it is now desired to provide for the financing of said costs,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT

RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF ERIE, NEW YORK (by the affirmative vote of not less than two-thirds of the voting strength of said Legislature), AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York, as amended (the "Law"), and to the provisions of other laws applicable thereto, \$5,000,000 bonds of the County, or so much thereof as may be

necessary, are hereby authorized to be issued to finance the cost of an increase and improvement of facilities for Erie County Sewer District No. 3, all as more fully described in the report and estimate of cost approved by the Board of Managers of said District on December 10, 2003 and filed with the County Legislature. The estimated maximum cost of said specific object or purpose, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and to the financing thereof, is \$5,000,000. The plan of financing includes the issuance of \$5,000,000 bonds herein authorized and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of such bonds, and the levy of a tax to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds and notes, the said principal and interest to be reimbursed to the County by assessment against the benefited areas in Erie County Sewer District No.3 and the contracting communities.

Section 2. The period of probable usefulness for the specific objects or purposes for which said \$5,000,000 bonds herein authorized to be issued, within the limitations of Section 11.00 a.4. of the Law, is forty (40) years.

<u>Section 3.</u> Current funds are not required to be provided as a down payment prior to the issuance of the \$5,000,000 bonds authorized herein, or any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation thereof, pursuant to Section 107.00 d.3. of said Law.

Section 4. The County intends to finance, and the Comptroller of the County is hereby authorized to advance such amounts as are necessary to pay the costs of the object or purpose described in Section 1 hereof prior to the issuance of the bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized out of any available funds of the County, on an interim basis, which amounts are reasonably expected to be reimbursed with the proceeds of debt to be incurred by the County, pursuant to this Resolution, in the maximum amount of bonds herein authorized. This Resolution is a declaration of official intent adopted pursuant to the requirements of Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2.

Section 5. Subject to the provisions of this Resolution and of the Law, and pursuant to the provisions of §30.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bond anticipation notes or the renewals thereof, and of §§50.00, 56.00 to 60.00 and 168.00 of said Law, the powers and duties of the County Legislature relative to authorizing the issuance of any notes in anticipation of the sale of the respective amounts of bonds herein authorized, or the renewals thereof, relative to providing for substantially level or declining annual debt service, relative to prescribing the terms, form and contents and as to the sale and issuance of the respective amounts of bonds herein authorized, and of any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds or the renewals of said notes, and relative to executing agreements for credit enhancement, are hereby delegated to the Comptroller of the County, as the chief fiscal officer of the County.

Section 6. Each of the bonds authorized by this Resolution and any bond .anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale thereof shall contain the recital of validity prescribed by Section 52.00 of said Local Finance Law and said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds shall be general obligations of the County of Erie, payable as to both principal and interest by general tax upon all the taxable real property within the County without limitation as to rate or amount. The faith and credit of the County are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said

bonds or the renewals of said notes, and provision shall be made annually in the budgets of the County by appropriation for (a) the amortization and redemption of the notes and bonds to mature in such year and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in such year.

<u>Section 7.</u> The validity of the bonds authorized by this Resolution and of any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, may be contested only if:

(a) such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the County is not authorized to expend money, or

(b) the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of this Resolution, or a summary hereof, are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity, is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or

(c) such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

Section 8. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon approval by the County Executive.

WHEREAS, The Buffalo and Erie County Botanical Gardens Society, Inc. ("Society") presents this letter of intent to the County of Erie ("County") for the purpose of outlining a proposed relationship for the ownership, governance, maintenance and operation of The Buffalo and Erie County Botanical Gardens at 2655 South Park Avenue, Buffalo, New York 14218 and the horticultural collection located there (collectively "Gardens").

The Society proposes to the County the following terms:

- A. <u>Preface</u>
  - 1. The Society and the County shall collaborate in the implementation of the "Proposed Plan, A Public-Private Partnership for Ownership and Operation of the Buffalo and Erie County Botanical Gardens, March, 2003" prepared by the Society ("Proposed Plan") which is incorporated herein by reference.
- B. <u>Ownership</u>
  - 1. Subject to Paragraph B.3. below, the County will continue to own the 11.4+ acres of real estate, including all improvements constructed thereon, located at 2655 South Park Avenue, Buffalo, New York 14218 ("Premises").

- 2. The Society will have the exclusive right to use and occupy the Premises for a term of twenty-five (25) years but only for the purpose of operating the Gardens for the education and recreation of the residents of and visitors to Erie County and the conservation of endangered plant species.
- 3. In order to permit the Society to attract non-governmental funding sources, to manage the collection and to fulfill the requirements of accrediting organizations such as the American Association of Museums ("AAM"), the County shall convey and the Society will own the horticultural collection with the exclusive right exercised in its sole discretion to acquire, propagate, replace, remove, substitute or eliminate specimens as best practice standards for the operation of a botanical gardens of this size and type shall indicate. The collection shall include all plantings, including lawns, whether located within or without buildings on the Premises.
- The County shall convey and the Society shall own all equipment, supplies and 4. other personal property (inclusive of the aforementioned horticultural collection) whether presently located on the Premises or hereafter acquired. Likewise, at the conclusion of the term hereof, the Society shall similarly convey and the County shall own all equipment, supplies and other personal property (including the then existing horticultural collection) then located on the Premises which had been originally conveyed by the County to the Society pursuant hereto together with any replacements for said equipment, supplies and other personal property then located on the Premises which had been purchased by or donated to the Society during the term hereof. It is not the intention of the parties however, that equipment, supplies and other personal property currently owned or hereafter acquired by the Society which are not replacements for equipment, supplies and personal property conveyed to the Society by the County pursuant hereto, will be conveyed to the County at the conclusion of the term hereof, provided that nothing in this sentence shall be deemed to limit the obligation of the Society to convey to the County all of the then existing horticultural collection located at the Premises at the expiration, or earlier termination, of the lease.
- 5. Subject to paragraph B.3 above, any capital improvements made to the Premises whether by the Society, the County or any other source, shall become part of the Premises and shall become the property of the County at the expiration or earlier termination of the Lease, free and clear of all liens and encumbrances placed by the Society or placed as a result of the Society's operations, except as otherwise may be agreed to in writing by the County during the term of the Lease.
- 6. At the commencement of the Lease and at least bi-annually thereafter the Society and the County shall cause there to be performed an inventory of the

personal property, equipment and capital improvements. The Society shall provide to the County an annual audit of its accounts and finances.

# C. <u>Governance</u>

- 1. The Society shall at all times maintain its status in good standing as a Not-For-Profit corporation organized in the State of New York which is tax exempt in accordance with Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.
- 2. The Erie County Executive, the County Public Works Commissioner and the County Parks Commissioner shall be ex-officio, voting members of the Board of Directors of the Society. The County Executive may annually designate an individual representative to act in his/her stead.
- 3. The Society shall comply with all obligations applicable to the Premises relating to its status as a "Historic Site" listed on the National Register of Historic Places and the New York State Register of Historic Places.
- 4. The Society shall cooperate with the County, the City of Buffalo, the City of Lackawanna, the New York State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation and the Olmsted Conservancy with respect to the making of capital improvements to the Premises and the operations of the Gardens in order to preserve and enhance its status as a "Historic Site" within an Olmsted Park.
- 5. The Society shall be governed by a Board of Directors selected without regard to race, creed, religion, gender, disability or national origin but who shall reflect diverse backgrounds and talents needed to operate botanical gardens.

# D. <u>Maintenance:</u>

- 1. The County shall convert the buildings located on the Premises to be "smart" buildings for the purposes of controlling and operating all HVAC systems. Until such improvements are completed and fully operational, the County shall provide at its expense qualified personnel to operate existing HVAC systems.
- 2. The County shall, within the limits of a series of capital budgets adopted by the County over the period from 2005 through and including 2013, fund and undertake a total of \$9 million of capital improvements to the buildings on the Premises, consistent with the Proposed Plan or as may otherwise be agreed to by the County and the Society which are necessary to operate the Gardens in a manner consistent with the standards of the AAM for accredited botanical gardens of its size and type and the Proposed Plan. Any such capital improvements made by the County shall remain the property of the County but shall be considered part of the Premises and Gardens for purposes of the Society's responsibilities under the Lease. As stated in E.6. below, the Society

shall seek contributions and grants from sources other than the County to help provide funding for the capital projects envisioned in the Proposed Plan.

- 3. The Society shall maintain, including daily and routine maintenance and repair the Premises in a clean and safe condition suitable for use by the Society or the public, as appropriate, in a manner consistent with its intended purpose. It is not intended that the Society's responsibility to maintain and repair the Premises shall substitute for or obviate the County's responsibilities to fund and undertake capital improvements as provided for herein.
- 4. The County shall provide or cause to be provided all electric service, City water service, natural gas service and/ or heating fuel oil to the Premises necessary for the operation of the Gardens without cost to the Society.

# E. <u>Operations:</u>

- 1. The Society shall be solely responsible for the operation (including management) of the Gardens in a manner consistent with the standards of the AAM for accredited botanical gardens of its size and type and the Proposed Plan.
- 2. With the exception of D.l. above, all management and staff personnel for the operation of the Gardens shall be employees of the Society who shall be hired without regard to race, creed, religion, gender, disability or national origin.
- 3. The County shall be responsible for negotiating revisions to all collective bargaining agreements to which it is a party insofar as such agreements relate to County employees currently working at the Gardens or on the Premises for the purpose of transferring or making other work assignments for such employees who shall remain part of the collective bargaining units. It is the intention of the parties hereto that all personnel employed by the Society for the operation of the Gardens shall not be members of such collective bargaining units.
- 4. The County represents, and the Society recognizes, that the County is selfinsured and that Premises and the Gardens fall within the County's selfinsurance plan. Additionally, the County shall cause any and all contractors and vendors who shall perform work or services for the County, at the Gardens, for which the County requires liability insurance, to name the Society as an additional insured on such insurance policies.

To the extent permitted by State law, the County shall indemnify, hold harmless, and defend the Society from all claims, lawsuits, costs, damages, or injuries to persons or property, including those relating to pollution, hazardous waste and materials, and other conditions of the Premises as leased or as improved by the County, arising out of the contractual duties and responsibilities of the County, except to the extent that such liability is attributable to the acts, omission, or negligence of the Society or its officers, employees, directors, agents or contractors. The Society shall at all times during the term hereof, maintain comprehensive liability, automobile liability, and excess liability insurance naming the County as an additional insured such forms and amounts as required and approved by the County Attorney. The Society shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless the County from all claims, lawsuits, costs, damages, or injuries to persons or property, including those relating to pollution, hazardous waste and materials, and other conditions of the Premises attributable to the operation or improvement of the Premises by the Society, arising out of the contractual duties and responsibilities of the Society, except to the extent that such liability is attributable to the acts, omission, or negligence of the County or its officers, employees, agents or contractors.

- 5. The County shall provide funding to the Society for the operation of the Gardens for a minimum term of five (5) fiscal years, in the amount of \$450,000/year. These sums payable pursuant hereto shall be exclusive of any Public Benefit Grants or Cultural Funding Grants upon which the Society is dependent to fund its operations.
- 6. The Society shall seek contributions and grants from other governmental sources, foundations, corporations and individuals to support the operations of the Gardens or to provide funding for the capital projects envisioned in the Proposed Plan. The Society shall have the right to name the entire, or any portion, of the Gardens, in recognition of particular contributions or grants to the Society or the Gardens. Approval of the naming of the entire Gardens shall be subject to the approval of the County Executive, which shall not be unreasonably withheld.
- 7. The Society may sell memberships, seek named program sponsorships, charge admission fees and undertake such other marketing and revenue generating activities to support financially the operations of the Gardens but in a manner consistent with the standards of the AAM for accredited botanical gardens of its size and type and the Proposed Plan.
- 8. The Society shall improve and expand its exhibits and programs adhering to the standards of the AAM for accredited botanical gardens of its size and type and the Proposed Plan. It is understood that this letter constitutes a non-binding letter of intent that expresses the wishes of the parties. Once executed, the County and the Society shall endeavor to prepare all legal documentation necessary and appropriate to effect its terms within one hundred and twenty (120) days.

In response to your letter dated April 21, 2004, I am writing to inform you that pursuant to Section 3.02 of the Erie County Legislature Rules of Order, I am exercising my authority as Chairman of the Erie County Legislature to convene a special committee to investigate the policies and procedures that led to the County Division of Purchase overpaying Buffalo Office Interiors (BOI) \$513,810.

I am troubled by Comptroller Nancy Naples' findings regarding these purchases. Her audit found that had the County administration utilized the State list, the BOI furniture purchases would have cost the taxpayers \$802,463 less than what the County actually paid BOI, and that the County paid BOI \$196,641 for furniture, carpets and tile "without valid purchasing bid contracts existing for these items." The Comptroller's audit stated "there was a failure by the Division of Purchase to ensure taxpayer dollars were spent in a cost effective manner... equally significant, there was a failure by BOI to honor the terms of their bid contracts."

### MEETING NO. 9 April 28, 2004

## ERIE COUNTY LEGISLATURE

Most critically, the Comptroller's audit reported that there was a failure of County purchasing procedures and guidelines, including the lack of legislative approval for the de facto standardization of County office furniture. Comptroller Naples recommended that the Director of Purchase and County Attorney initiate steps to "recoup overpayments made to BOI" and "create and implement review procedures to ensure the County is paying the best possible price for materials."

The highest duty of the Erie County Legislature is to protect the interest of the taxpaying public. As such, this Honorable Body's role as fiscal guardian demands that this body review the policies and procedures concerning purchases made by the County.

Accordingly, I will shortly convene a special committee of legislators to review the policies and procedures of the Division of Purchase. I expect that the committee will work with and coordinate with the County Comptroller as well as the New York State Comptroller to investigate this matter and to create new policies and procedures to ensure such a violation of the public trust does not happen again.

Thank you in advance for your cooperation with this inquiry. We look forward to your full and complete cooperation and assistance.

A LOCAL LAW amending, Local Law No. 1-1959, constituting the Erie County Charter as amended, in relation to the re-establishment, restructuring and reconvening of the Erie County Charter Revision Commission.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE ERIE COUNTY LEGISLATURE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. PURPOSE. Section 1907 of Article 19 of Local Law #1-1959 constituting the Erie County Charter, as amended, establishing a Charter Revision Commission is repealed, and a new Section 1907 hereby establishing a Charter Revision Commission for the year 2004 is established as a fully amending Section 1907 of the Erie County Charter.

Section 2. CHARTER REVISION COMMISSION. That upon the adoption of this Local Law the County Legislature hereby creates a Charter Revision Commission to be established on or before April 15, 2004.

Section 3. THE PERVIEW OF THE CHARTER REVISION COMMISSION. The Charter Revision Commission shall study the operations of the County of Erie in their full scope; and shall consider the inter-municipal relations of the County of Erie and the myriad responsibilities that the County of Erie discharges in the course of its broadly defined duties to determine whether the Erie County Charter and the Erie County Administrative Code shall be further amended to render same as an effective framework for County government, and to adopt such amendments as may be necessary to facilitate the delivery of services to the public and to better coordinate the functions between departments and agencies of the County and the various Cities, Towns and Villages within the County. The Charter Revision Commission shall submit a final report, which shall include its findings, conclusions, and recommendations for appropriate action to the County Legislature and the County Executive on or before the 15 h day of April, 2005.

Section 4. METHODOLOGY OF OPERATION. The Commission shall be provided with adequate funding for staff and costs incident to the discharge of its responsibilities as may be deemed necessary by the Erie County Legislature in the furtherance of its assigned duties.

Section 5. MEMBERSHIP. The Charter Revision Commission shall be composed of 23 members with one (1) member to be appointed by each District Legislator of the Erie County Legislature. The County Executive of the County of Erie shall appoint three (3) members, and the County Clerk, County Comptroller, County Sheriff, and the County District Attorney of the County of Erie shall have one appointee each to the Commission. In addition to the other designated appointment, the Chair of the Erie County Legislature shall also appoint the Chairperson of the Charter Revision Commission.

No member of the Commission shall hold public office or be an employee of the County during the term of his/her appointment.

Section 6. REPORTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS. The County Legislature shall act on all reports and recommendations submitted to it in a time1y fashion by the Charter Revision Commission by either approving or disapproving each recommendation separately within three (3) months from the date of the submission of the findings, conclusions and report of the Commission.

Pursuant to section 205 of the Erie County Charter, I am writing you to indicate my disapproval of the above-referenced Local Law Intro., a copy of which is attached.

My first objection stems from the fact that the sales tax revenue figure and other revenue that must be set forth in the proposed budget cannot be forecast properly until approximately three-fourths of the year has passed. Accordingly, given this forecasting issue, it would be impossible to meet the time frame as set forth in this Local Law Intro.

Objection number two relates to the strictures imposed on us by the State's own budget processes. At present, the State routinely passes its budget beyond its April deadline (a deadline that may soon be officially extended to May). Our County proposed budget cannot be refined until we have a clear idea of the monies coming to us from the State. Given these facts, this Local Law Intro., which sets earlier deadlines for the County proposed budget, cannot stand, for it would institute an unworkably short period during which State information could be analyzed and digested.

My final objection is managerial. The County engages and contracts with consultants and advisors throughout the year. Their terms of engagement are committed after the passage of an annual County budget and usually their work is completed within the same fiscal year. It would create undue hardship and reduce the timeframe for these paid consultants to complete their tasks upon which the County may rely in the budget process.

A LOCAL LAW amending, Local Law No. 1-1959, as amended, constituting the Erie County Charter Section 1802 thereof; and the Erie County Administrative Code Section 18.02 Sub. f with respect to the duty of the Erie County Executive to submit a budget and capital program to the Erie County Legislature.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE ERIE COUNTY LEGISLATURE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Short title. This Local Law shall be known as the "Erie County Budget Disclosure Act" and shall amend, as hereinafter specified Section 1802 of the Erie County Charter and Section 18.02 Sub. f of the Erie County Administrative Code.

Section 2. Legislative Intent. The Erie County Legislature hereby determines that the people of Erie County have the right to know the contents of and fiscal implication of County Executive's tentative budget for the ensuing fiscal year, and the extent of the capital program to ensure fiscal accountability.

Section 3. Provisions. The following provisions shall be inserted to amend the Erie County Charter and the Administrative Code to the extent of the provisions hereinafter set forth.

- (A) On or before the 15<sup>th</sup> day of October of each year the County Executive shall submit to the County Legislature a tentative budget for the ensuing fiscal year, a capital program for the next six (6) fiscal years, and an accompanying message.
- (B) Henceforth upon the enactment of this Local Law on or before the 15<sup>th</sup> day of October the County Executive shall submit the tentative budget (including both the operation and maintenance budget and the capital budget) for the ensuing year and the capital program for the ensuing six (6) fiscal years, together with an accompanying message to the County Legislature.

Section 4. Publication. The Clerk of the Erie County Legislature is hereby authorized and directed to cause a copy of the foregoing Local Law to be published in the County's official newspapers.

Section 5. Effective Date. This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon the filing with the Secretary of State pursuant to Section 27 of the New York State Municipal Home Rule Law.

WHEREAS, since 1992, Wireless 911 calls made on AT&T, Cricket, Cingular, Sprint and T Mobile cellular telephones from within Erie County have all been automatically routed for appropriate emergency dispatching and response to the E-911 Public Safety Answering Point [PSAP] operated by the Erie County Department of Central Police Services [CPS] within the City of Buffalo Police Department Headquarters Building, while Wireless 911 calls made on Verizon & Nextel cellular telephones have been automatically routed to the PSAP which is operated by the New York State Police out of its Clarence Barracks, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of County Law § 330, which became effective in 2002, Erie County is empowered to designate the one or more than one PSAP to receive Wireless 911 calls in Erie County, and

WHEREAS, rather than continuing to have more than one PSAP receive Wireless 911 calls, CPS has recommended that all Wireless 911 calls be automatically routed to and received by a single PSAP in Erie County, namely, the E-911 PSAP operated by Erie County CPS within the City of Buffalo Police Department Headquarters Building, and
