





WHEREAS, recent national news stories have reported the return of (Pertussis) Whooping Cough, which was thought to be almost eradicated in the United States due to systematic immunization of infants since the 1940's, and

WHEREAS, the disease was one of the most common causes of death in childhood before immunization efforts began, with more than 175,000 people every year in the United States contracting the disease, and

WHEREAS, last year, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, there were 11,647 known U.S. cases of (Pertussis) Whooping Cough, a 30-year high, with one-fifth of the cases in children less than a year old, and

WHEREAS, most people, including professionals misunderstand the disease, which results in many cases never getting diagnosed, and

WHEREAS, cases of (Pertussis) Whooping Cough have been reported in 20 states: Florida, Oklahoma, South Carolina, Texas, Pennsylvania, Illinois, Maine, Missouri, Wisconsin, Ohio, New Jersey, Tennessee, New Mexico, Massachusetts, Minnesota, Colorado, Arkansas, California, Washington and New York, and

WHEREAS, (Pertussis) Whooping Cough is extremely infectious and renders those who contract it contagious for up to several weeks, and

WHEREAS, because the disease is so difficult to diagnose many sufferers or their parents spend months of anxiety, living with a desperately severe cough, unable to convey its severity to the doctors they are seeking help from because they are often told it is a virus or asthma, and

WHEREAS, it is important for the Erie County Legislature to be updated on the threat of (Pertussis) Whooping Cough to our community, as well as the efforts that are underway in the Erie County Health Department to prevent the spread of the disease and educate the public,

WHEREAS, under the Erie County Charter, the Erie County Administrative Code, and the Adopted 2004 Erie County Budget, the Erie County Executive and his department heads maintain numerous fiscal and budgetary obligations, including specific reporting provisions to the Erie County Legislature, and

WHEREAS, among those many financial and budgetary obligations, the County Executive, through his Director of the Division of Budget, Management and Finance, is required to transmit to the Legislature, the monthly budget monitoring reports (BMRs) produced by his staff that provide critical details concerning the county's year-to-date fiscal situation, such as actual and budgeted expenditures and revenues and variances, and

WHEREAS, those BMRs are required to be submitted to the Legislature within 30 days of the close of each month, and

WHEREAS, since taking office, the administration of County Executive Giambra has routinely and regularly failed to submit BMRs in the required timeframe, with the administration routinely refusing to submit BMRs at all for many months during 2003 and 2004, and

WHEREAS, for instance, in 2003, the three (3) BMRs for January, February and March were not delivered until May 6, 2003, and were only provided as a single BMR, and the two (2) BMRs for May and June were not delivered until August 22, 2003, and were only provided as a single BMR, and

WHEREAS, the two BMRs for August and September 2003 were not delivered until January 5, 2004, and were only provided as a single BMR, and

WHEREAS, the Giambra Administration completely failed to provide BMRs for November and December 2003, and

WHEREAS, the three (3) BMRs for January, February and March 2004 were not delivered until July 1, 2004, and were only provided as a single BMR, and

WHEREAS, the three (3) BMRs for April, May and June 2004 were not delivered until September 22, 2004, and were only provided as a single BMR, and

WHEREAS, the BMR for July 2004, which was due September 1, 2004, has still not been provided to the Legislature, and

WHEREAS, for the past two years, despite a formal requirement to do so, the few and infrequent BMRs provided by the Giambra Administration have not included the comprehensive year-end forecast showing projected gains and losses for the year – thus preventing the Legislature from engaging in its Charter-required duty to monitor the County's finances, and

WHEREAS, this repeated failure to comply with the Charter and Code had in fact, led the Legislature to unanimously adopt a resolution, Intro. 6-1, on March 7, 2002, with the Comptroller's support, requiring the administration to provide monthly BMRs with year-end forecasts, and

WHEREAS, in a common recognition of the problem and the repeated, systematic failure of the County Executive and his Budget Director to comply with their Charter, Code and Budget requirements, since 2002, the Erie County Comptroller has joined with the Legislature and been on record expressing her concern over the administration's failure to provide timely or detailed BMRs, with Comptroller Naples stating in January 2002 that this is "not adequate," and "It is imperative that more complete, more timely, and more understandable financial information be prepared and made available to the legislature and the taxpayers," and

WHEREAS, on September 24, 2004, the Comptroller noted and reiterated her concern over the administration's failure or refusal to provide timely and complete BMRs, stating that "it is irresponsible for the Administration to withhold financial forecasts," and "the Administration is choosing not to forecast year-end financial results."

RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF ERIE, NEW YORK (by the affirmative vote of not less than two thirds of the voting strength of said Legislature), AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The County of Erie, New York (herein called "County"), is hereby authorized to design and reconstruct various County highways, as further described in "Attachment A" appended hereto and by reference made a part hereof, including pavement and shoulder widening, drainage improvements, sight distance and safety improvements. The estimated maximum cost of said specific object or purpose, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and to the financing thereof, is \$4,000,000, and said amount is hereby appropriated therefor pursuant to the duly adopted Capital Budget of said County for fiscal year 2004. To the extent that the details set forth in this resolution are inconsistent with any details set forth in the 2004 Capital Budget of the County, such Budget shall be deemed and is hereby amended. The plan of financing includes the issuance of \$4,000,000 bonds of the County to finance said appropriation, and the levy and collection of taxes on all the taxable real property in the County to pay the principal of said bonds and the interest thereon as the same shall become due and payable.

Section 2. Bonds of the County in the principal amount of \$4,000,000 are "hereby authorized to be issued for the specific object or purpose described in Section 1 hereof, pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (herein called "Law") to finance said appropriation.

Section 3. The period of probable usefulness applicable to the specific object or purpose for which said \$4,000,000 bonds herein authorized are to be issued, within the limitations of Section 11;00 a. 20 (b) of the Law, is ten (10) :years.

Section 4. The County intends to finance, and the Comptroller of the County is hereby authorized to advance such amounts as are necessary to pay the costs of the object or purpose described in Section 1 hereof prior to the issuance of the bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized out of any available funds of the County, on an interim basis, which amounts are reasonably expected to be reimbursed with the proceeds of debt to be incurred by the County, pursuant to this Bond Resolution, in the maximum amount of bonds herein authorized. This Resolution is a declaration of official intent adopted pursuant to the requirements of Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2.

Section 5. The faith and credit of the County are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds or the renewals of said notes, and provision shall be made annually in the budgets of the County by appropriation for (a) the amortization and redemption of the notes and bonds to mature in such year and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in such year.

<u>Section 7.</u> The validity of the bonds authorized by this Resolution and of any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, may be: contested only if:

- (a) such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the County is not authorized to expend money, or
- (b) the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of this Resolution or a summary hereof, are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity, is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or
