COUNTY OF ERIE LOCAL LAW NO. ____ – 2004 LOCAL LAW INTRO. NO. 19–2004

A LOCAL LAW in relation to a mandatory notification requirement for commercial and residential lawn pesticide applications.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ERIE COUNTY AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Title.

This law shall be known as the Erie County Mandatory Pesticide Notification Act.

Section 2. Legislative Intent.

The Erie County Legislature hereby finds, declares and determines that individuals and their personal property can come into unintended contact with pesticides applied on abutting property from commercial and residential lawn applications. This Legislature further finds that pesticides may pose health and safety risks to the citizens of this County.

In December 2003, through passage of Erie County Local Law No. 8 of 2003, Erie County opted into the New York State pesticide notification program for a period of one year. The Erie County Local Law provided for a one-year sunset provision, with a required review by the Erie County Environmental Management Council at the end of the year to determine the effectiveness of the law.

On October 5, 2004, the Erie County Environmental Management Council submitted its one-year review to the Erie County Legislature and Erie County Executive. The Council recommended that the Pesticide Notification Law be renewed.

Therefore, the Erie County Legislature does hereby conclude that Erie County should adopt the notice requirements for the commercial and residential lawn application of pesticides as set forth in Section 33-1004 of the New York Environmental Conservation Law. It is intended that this Local Law be read and applied consistently with that section and all other applicable provisions of the Environmental Conservation Law and the regulations promulgated thereunder.

Section 3. Definitions.

All terms used herein shall be as defined in Article 33 of the New York Environmental Conservation Law:

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a. "Abutting property" shall mean any property which has any boundary or boundary point in common with the property on which the pesticide is to be applied.

b. "Agency" means any state agency; municipal corporation; public authority; college, as that term is defined in the education law; railroad, as that term is defined in the railroad law; or telegraph, telephone, telegraph and telephone, pipeline, gas, electric, or gas and electric corporation as those terms are defined in the transportation corporations law, which applies pesticides.

c. "Commercial lawn application" means the application of pesticide to ground, trees, or shrubs on public or private outdoor property. For the purposes of this local law the following shall not be considered commercial lawn application:

(1) the application of pesticide for the purpose of producing an agricultural commodity;

(2) residential application of pesticides;

(3) the application of pesticides around or near the foundation of a building for the purpose of indoor pest control;

(4) the application of pesticides by or on behalf of agencies except that agencies shall be subject to visual notification requirements pursuant to section 33-1003 of the New York Environmental Conservation Law where such application is within one-hundred feet of a dwelling, multiple dwelling, public building, or public park; and

(5) the application of pesticides on golf courses or turf farms.

d. "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation.

e. "Dwelling" means any building or structure or portion thereof which is occupied in whole or in part as the home, residence or sleeping place for one or two families.

f. "General use pesticide" means a pesticide which does not meet the state criteria for a restricted pesticide as established under authority of section 33-303 of the New York Environmental Conservation Law.

g. "Multiple dwelling" means any dwelling which is to be occupied by or is occupied as the residence or home of three or more families living independently of each other.

h. "Pesticide" means:

(1) any substance or mixture of substances intended for preventing, destroying, repelling or mitigating any pest; and

(2) any substance or mixture of substances intended for use as a plant regulator, defoliant, or desiccant.

i. 'Premises" means land and improvements or appurtenances or any part thereof.

j. "Residential lawn application" means the application of general use pesticides to ground, trees, or shrubs on property owned by or leased to the individual making such application. For the purposes of this local law, the following shall not be considered residential lawn application:

(1) the application of pesticides for the purpose of producing an agricultural commodity;

(2) the application of pesticides around or near the foundation of a building for the purpose of indoor pest control;

(3) the application of pesticides by or on behalf of agencies except that agencies shall be subject to visual notification requirements pursuant to section 33-1003 of the New York Environmental Conservation Law where such application is within one hundred feet of a dwelling, multiple dwelling, public building or public park; and (4) the application of pesticides on golf courses or turf farms.

Section 4. Notification Requirements For Commercial And Residential Lawn Applications.

The provisions in this section are adopted in their entirety and without exception, pursuant to section 33-1004 of the New York Environmental Conservation Law.

a. Retail Consumer Information Sign.

(1) All retail establishments that sell general use pesticides for commercial or residential lawn application shall display a sign meeting standards, established by the Commissioner pursuant to subdivision one of section 33-1005 of the Environmental Conservation Law, in a conspicuous place, and such sign shall be placed as close as possible to the place where such pesticides are displayed.

b. Prior Notification of Commercial Lawn Applications.

At least forty-eight hours prior to any commercial lawn application of a pesticide, the person or business making such application shall supply written notice, as defined in subdivision three of section 33-1005 of the New York Environmental Conservation Law, to:

 a. occupants of all dwellings on abutting property with a boundary that is within one hundred fifty feet of the site of such application; and to

b. owners, owner's agents, or other persons in a position of authority for all other types of premises that are on abutting property with a boundary that is within one hundred fifty feet of the site of such application. Owners or owner's agents of multiple family dwellings shall supply such written notice to the occupants of such multiple family dwellings and for all other types of premises, owners, owner's agents or other persons in a position of authority shall post such written notice in a manner specified by the Commissioner.

(2) Such prior notification provisions shall not apply to the following:

a. the application of anti-microbial pesticides and anti-microbial products as defined by the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA) in 7 U.S.C. Section 136 (mm) and 136 q (h) (2);

b. the use of an aerosol product with a directed spray, in containers of eighteen fluid ounces or less, when used to protect individuals from an imminent threat from stinging and biting insects, including venomous spiders, bees, wasps and hornets. This section shall not exempt from notification the use of any fogger product or aerosol product that discharges to a wide area;

c. the use of non-volatile insect or rodent bait in a tamper resistant container;

d. the application of a pesticide classified by the United States Environmental Protection Agency as an exempt material under 40 CFR Part 152.25;

e. the application of a pesticide which the United States Environmental Protection Agency has determined satisfies its reduced risk criteria, including a biopesticide; f. the use of boric acid and disodium octaborate tetrahydrate;

g. the use of horticultural soap and oils that do not contain synthetic pesticides or synergists;

h. the application of a granular pesticide, where granular pesticide means any ground applied solid pesticide that is not a dust or powder;

i. the application of a pesticide by direct injection into a plant or the ground;j. the spot application of a pesticide, where spot application means the application of pesticide in a manually pressurized or non-pressurized container of thirty-two fluid ounces or less to an area of ground less than nine square feet;

k. the application of a pesticide to the ground or turf of any cemetery; and l. an emergency application of a pesticide when necessary to protect against any imminent threat to human health, provided, however, that prior to any such emergency application, the person providing such application shall make a good faith effort to supply the written notice required pursuant to this title. Upon making an emergency application, the person making such application shall notify the Commissioner of the New York State Department of Health, using a form developed by such Commissioner for such purposes that shall include minimally the name of the person making such application, the pesticide business registration number or certified applicator number of the person making such application, the location of such application, the date of such application, the product name and United States Environmental Protection Agency registration number of the pesticide applied and the reason for such application.

c. Posting of Residential Lawn Applications.

 All persons performing residential lawn applications treating an area more than one hundred square feet shall affix markers to be placed within or along the perimeter of the area where pesticides will be applied. Markers are to be placed so as to be clearly visible to persons immediately outside the perimeter of such property. Such markers shall be posted at least twelve inches above the ground and shall be at least four inches by five inches in size.
 The markers required pursuant to this paragraph shall be in place on the day during which the pesticide is being applied and shall instruct persons not to enter the property and not to remove the signs for a period of at least twenty-four hours. Such instruction shall be printed boldly in letters at least three-eighths of an inch in height.

Section 5. Enforcement.

a. Pursuant to section 33-1004 of the New York Environmental Conservation Law, the Erie County Department of Health shall enforce the provisions of this local law administratively, provided that all sanctions, which shall be assessed after providing a hearing or opportunity to be heard, shall be as specified in Section 6 of this law and shall be payable to and deposited with Erie County.

Section 6. Penalties.

a. Administrative Sanctions

(1) A person providing a commercial lawn application who violates any provision of this local law shall be liable for a civil penalty not to exceed five thousand dollars for a first violation, and not to exceed ten thousand dollars for a subsequent offense after a hearing or opportunity to be heard.

(2) An owner or owner's agent of a multiple dwelling or owner, owner's agent or a person in a position of authority for all other types of premises, who violates any rule or regulation pursuant to subdivision b (1)(b) of section 4 of this local law (Prior Notification of Commercial Lawn Applications), and a person who violates any provision of subdivision c of section 4 (Posting of Residential Lawn Applications), shall for a first such violation, in lieu of a penalty, be issued a written warning and shall also be issued educational materials prepared by the Commissioner pursuant to subdivision two of section 33-1005 of the New York Environmental Conservation Law. Such person shall, however, for a second violation, be liable for a civil penalty not to exceed one hundred dollars, and not to exceed two hundred fifty dollars for any subsequent violation after a hearing or opportunity to be heard.

(3) Any person who violates the provisions of subdivision a of section 4 of this local law (Retail Consumer Information Sign) shall be issued a warning for the first violation and shall be provided seven days to correct such violation; and shall be liable for a civil penalty not to exceed one hundred dollars for a second violation, and not to exceed two hundred fifty dollars for a subsequent violation after a hearing or opportunity to be heard.

b. Criminal Sanctions for Persons Providing Commercial Lawn Applications.

(1) Any person providing a commercial lawn application and having the culpable mental states defined in subdivision one or two of section 15.05 or in section 20.20 of the New York Penal Law, who violates any provision of this local law, except an offense relating to the application of a general use pesticide, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine not to exceed five thousand dollars for each day during which such violation continues or by imprisonment for a term of not more than one year, or by both such fine and imprisonment. If the conviction is for a subsequent offense committed after a first conviction of such person under this subdivision, punishment shall be by a fine not to exceed ten thousand dollars for each day during which such violation continues or by imprisonment for a term of not more than one year. (2) Any person providing a commercial lawn application who violates any provision of this local law relating to the use of a general use pesticide shall be guilty of a violation and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine not to exceed twenty-five hundred dollars. If the conviction is for a subsequent offense committed after the first such conviction of such person under this subdivision, punishment dollars.

Section 7. Severability.

a. If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section, or part of this law or the application thereof to any person, individual, corporation, firm, partnership, entity, or circumstance shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order or judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section, or part of this law, or in its application to the person, individual, corporation, firm, partnership, entity, or circumstance directly involved in the controversy in which such order or judgment shall be rendered.

Section 8. Notice Requirements to State Officials.

a. Within twenty days after adoption of this law, the Clerk of the Erie County Legislature shall forward one certified copy thereof to the Commissioner of the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation and one to the New York State Attorney General.

Section 9. Repeals.

Erie County Local Law No. 8 of 2003 is hereby repealed.

Section 10. Effective Date.

a. This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State pursuant to Section 27 of the New York State Municipal Home Rule Law provided, however that the provisions of this local law shall expire and be deemed repealed on and after January first, the year two thousand and seven.

WHEREAS, the County and the Erie County Medical Center Corporation (ECMCC) entered into a Sale, Purchase and Operation Agreement (SPOA), effective January 1, 2004, setting forth each party's rights and obligations with regard to the operation of the Medical Center and Erie County Home; and

WHEREAS, the SPOA permits the County and ECMCC to continue to provide services for one another, provided that such services are agreed to in writing; and

WHEREAS, prior to the effective date of the SPOA, the County defended ECMCC's predecessor, the Erie County Medical Center Healthcare Network ("Network") against workers compensation and automobile liability claims and paid settlements or judgments related thereto from County funds; and

WHEREAS, ECMCC applied to the New York State Workers Compensation Board and the Department of Motor Vehicles to become self-insured with regard to workers compensation and automobile liability claims but both applications were denied, in large part because ECMCC is a new corporation without a credit history required to become self-insured; and

WHEREAS, ECMCC has requested that the County guaranty payment of ECMCC's workers compensation and automobile liability claims in the event ECMCC defaults on its payment on one or more of these claims.

WHEREAS, in a resolution of the Erie County Legislature dated July 15, 2004 (Intro. 17-16), the County subsidy to ECMCC was reduced by \$4,797,520.60 in accordance with the creation of an escrow account to fund debt service for fiscal year 2004; and

WHEREAS, the net subsidy owed to ECMCC by the County (less debt service) is \$25,748,511, and this amount is comprised of \$14,096,840 for ECMCC operating expenses and \$11,651,671 from tobacco monies for various capital purposes; and

WHEREAS, the SPOA will have to be amended to account for the fact that \$11,651,671 of the \$29,500,000 subsidy is for various capital purposes; and

WHEREAS, in addition to contributing \$11,651,671, the County is also required pursuant to the SPOA to provide \$3,183,585 of capital improvement work, approximately \$12,700,000 in ongoing capital improvements and \$23,037,300 in funding for the Erie County Medical Center Network's existing capital program for the years 2004, 2005 and 2006, as authorized in the County's 2003 capital budget; and

WHEREAS, in 2004 ECMCC was required to perform emergency upgrades on their computer system in the amount of approximately \$750,000, construction and renovation of the cardio-thoracic unit and ambulatory care unit in the amount of \$1,275,000, fourth floor renovation in the amount of \$900,000, radiology equipment replacement and upgrades in the amount of \$1,500,000, and miscellaneous hospital equipment in the amount of \$500,000, and ECMCC is seeking reimbursement from the County as part of the capital expenditures earmarked for ECMCC.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the resolution enacted by the Erie County Legislature on July 15, 2004 (Intro 17-16), and the 2004 Erie County Budget, is hereby amended by eliminating the sum of \$4,797,520.60 as an offset to the operating subsidy due ECMCC and restoring this amount to the subsidy; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the sum of \$11,651,671 constitutes part of the \$29,500,000 subsidy to ECMCC in fiscal year 2004 less the offset of \$3,751,489 attributable to budgeted interest expense on bonded indebtedness retained by the County; and be it further

RESOLVED, that Section 12.2 of the SPOA, as amended, be further amended by accounting for the fact that the 2004 ECMCC subsidy includes the sum of \$11,651,671 for various capital purposes in fiscal year 2004; and be it further

RESOLVED, that if the total appropriations made to date by this Legislature are insufficient to cover the entire 2004 ECMCC subsidy of \$29,500,000, the Budget Office, with the advice and

consent of the Comptroller's Office, will submit a subsequent resolution to this Legislature to appropriate additional funds for this purpose; and be it further

∉ DELETE SECTIONS 1.01 and 1.02 of the 2004 RULES of ORDER for the ERIE COUNTY LEGISLATURE and REPLACE with the FOLLOWING

1.01 CHAIRPERSON

Annually, the members of the Erie County Legislature shall meet to organize no later than the 8th day of January in each calendar year. At such meeting, or at a recessed meeting, the legislature shall select a member of the legislature as the Chairperson by an affirmative vote of at least a majority of the entire membership of the legislature. Upon his or her election, the Chairperson shall immediately assume all of the duties and responsibilities of the office.

The Chairperson shall possess the following powers and perform the following duties:

- 1. To preside over all meetings of the full Legislature; call the Legislature to order, direct a call of the roll, and, except in the absence of a quorum, proceed to business in a manner prescribed by these rules;
- 2. To preserve order and decorum;
- 3. To execute on behalf of the Legislature contracts and/or contract amendments and other documents authorized by the County Legislature and to execute all contracts necessary for the day-to-day operation and administration of the County Legislature without additional Legislative authorization;
- 4. To decide all questions of order, subject to appeal of the Legislature as hereinafter provided;
- 5. To recess meetings;
- 6. If the Legislature is ready to go into Committee of the Whole, to name a Chairperson to preside over such committee;
- 7. To be a voting member ex-officio of all committees and to receive notice of all meetings thereof;
- 8. To serve as the Department Head of the Legislature, and to appoint and designate or terminate, within the budgetary appropriations, all officers and employees of the Legislature not required to be selected by other means under these Rules, or other State or County law;
- 9 To establish guidelines and criteria and approve the expenditure of funds in the budget of the Legislature for the printing and/or mailing of literature by members of the Legislature to their constituents within the appropriations therefore; provided, however, that: no such literature shall be mailed at or delivered to any postal facility by such members during the period of fortyfive (45) days immediately prior to a date of a primary or general election in which such member is included or involved as a candidate, whether such election is a special, primary, or runoff election, and as provided for in section 5.07 of these rules.

- 10. To establish independent committees, boards, and commissions to report to the Chairperson and/or Legislature, and appoint or remove the members thereof;
- 11. To cancel public hearings for which the underlying Local Law has been withdrawn;
- 12. Such other powers as may be set forth in more detail in these Rules or in state, federal, or local legislation.

1.02 MAJORITY AND MINORITY LEADERS:

Annually, the enrolled members of the two political parties which shall have the greatest number of members seated in the Legislature shall elect a leader of their respective parties. The leader of the political party whose membership of the Legislature constitutes a majority of the Legislature shall be known as the Majority Leader. The leader of the other party shall be known as Minority Leader.

For the purpose of complying with the provisions of Section 200, subdivision 1 of the County Law, in the event that neither the members of one party nor the other constitute a majority of the members of the County Legislature, the Chairperson of the Legislature shall designate one party leader as the Majority Leader and the other as the Minority Leader for the purpose of budgetary appropriation and other matters.
