WHEREAS, the NYSDOH has provided funding for the Erie County Radon/Indoor Air Quality Program for over ten years; and

WHEREAS, Erie County has received \$53,172 in supplemental Tribal Community Reducing Toxic Air Pollutants Project (162TRIBECOMM0507) funding; and

WHEREAS, Erie County received notification of award from the NYSDOH on March 23, 2006, for an additional \$46,000 in grant funding to extend the State Indoor Radon Grant Program (SIRG 11); and

WHEREAS, the additional grant funding will extend the SIRG Program through June of 2007; and

WHEREAS, the current budget requires revision to maintain program continuity and allow the County to most efficiently utilize the additional grant resources.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

WHEREAS, In March 2003, the administration of Erie County Executive Joel A. Giambra presented a Parks Department Master Plan that included an initiative to institute an "Active Forest

Management Program" for the 3,100 acres of County-owned land located in the Towns of Boston, Concord, Holland and Sardinia in southern Erie County; and

WHEREAS, Objectives of the Active Forest Management Program (Forest Program) were "creating educational and economic opportunities for taxpayers, community groups, and educators; utilizing the Woodlands Environmental Education Center and certain Lots for scientific experiments in ecology and forestry; putting forest products to good use in County departments, and for public use; reducing taxes through profits from sales of lumber products; providing for water resources protection, wildlife habitat enhancement and fire protection; and encouraging/enhancing recreational use;" and

WHEREAS, The Forest Program listed its primary objective as "creating sustainable forests in Erie County for the 21st Century," and included establishing new revenue for Erie County from the sale of felled trees for firewood and the "selective harvesting of timber on a scheduled basis to produce moderate income over a long period of time" for Erie County from logging operations; and

WHEREAS, The Four Year Fiscal Plan mandated by the Erie County Fiscal Stability Authority included the sale of forest products as an initiative that projected net new revenues for Erie County of \$120,000 in 2006, \$239,000 in 2007, \$244,000 in 2008, and \$250,000 in 2009; and

WHEREAS, Additionally, the Department of Parks, Recreation and Forestry has included in its 2006 adopted budget revenue projections of \$490,600 in profits from the sale of forest products, well above the \$120,000 projected in the Four Year Plan; and

WHEREAS, As of October 5, 2006, actual revenue netted by Erie County from the sale of forest products total \$213,867, well below the \$490,600 budgeted, and on track to result in a budget shortfall of \$276,733 for the Parks, Recreation and Forestry Department; and

WHEREAS, The Forest Program's logging operations currently are in "Phase One," which essentially is a demonstration project with the objective of removing felled trees, and thinning/harvesting forests on Forest Lots 3 and 7, a small portion of the overall 3,100 acres of the Erie County Forest; and

WHEREAS, The Parks, Recreation and Forestry Department has indicated their intent to begin planning for "Phase Two" and expand logging to include additional Forest Lots with the submission to this Legislature of Communication 14E-11, currently before the Energy & Environment Committee; and

WHEREAS, "Phase One" of logging has generated considerable controversy; among the environmental and conservation communities, elected representatives in the communities most affected by logging operations, residents who reside within close proximity to Forest Lots 3 and 7, complaints concerning transparency and openness in the process that led to the Forest Program, and the utilization of the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA), the preparation of an environmental impact statement and submission of a statement called a "Positive Declaration," which relates to the logging operations and any possible "significant adverse impact" resulting from such an endeavor; and

WHEREAS, Representatives from the environmental and conservation communities further voiced concerns that any additional forest management planning includes consideration of the option of no management of the Erie County Forest, due to the forest's economic value for education, recreation, tourism, animal habitat, soil and water conservation and carbon sequestration; all of which values are diminished if even sustainable harvesting becomes the forest objective, in their view; and

WHEREAS, The Forest Program itself was the subject of a review by the Office of Erie County Comptroller, which highlighted 17 major deficiencies, including findings critical of the Request for Proposals process, lack of accountability in the cutting of trees and auction of timber, possible conflicts of interest among contractors, along with concerns about an expected shortfall for the 2006 adopted budget of the Parks, Recreation and Forestry Department due to an overestimate in the amount of profits from the sale of forest products; and

WHEREAS, "Phase One" of logging operations was the subject of considerable review by this Legislature's Energy & Environment Committee, which conducted a tour of Forest Lots 3 & 7 with concerned citizens, the Erie County Forester, and representatives from the firm contracted to implement logging operations; was the subject of a number of discussions at meetings of the Energy & Environment Committee, and was the subject of a lengthy hearing conducted at the October 5, 2006 meeting of the Energy & Environment Committee during the consideration of Comm. 14E-11, at which time all stakeholders involved were given an opportunity to review "Phase One" of logging operations, and to express their views concerning the proposed planning for "Phase Two" of logging; and

WHEREAS, During these discussions a consensus has emerged among most stakeholders, that instituting a Forest Program for the Erie County Forest is sound and proactive public policy, and that although the program's forest management strategies including the removal of felled trees and the scheduled harvesting of selective trees to encourage new growth and habitat enhancement is environmentally sound, logging operations contained within the Forest Program are seriously troubled and call for Legislative redress.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, That the Erie County Legislature does hereby go on record in support of an Active Forest Management Program for the Erie County Forest, located in the Towns of Boston, Concord, Holland and Sardinia; and be it further

RESOLVED, That this Legislature acknowledges the spirit in which the Erie County Parks, Recreation and Forestry Department aimed to improve the Erie County Forest through the development of a Forest Program, including the intent to create many opportunities for the utilization of the forest for positive activities for residents, the utilization of forest products for County and public use, the savings of tax dollars by the sale of forest products, and the clearing of felled trees and the scheduled harvesting of selective trees to encourage new growth and habitat enhancement, among other objectives; and be it further

RESOLVED, That this Legislature also acknowledges that with a number of opportunities for public dialogue provided by this Legislature's Energy & Environment Committee, a clear consensus has emerged that while the Forest Program was well-intended, that the planning, implementation and accountability of the program and "Phase One" of the plan's logging operations are problematic; and be it further

RESOLVED, That this Legislature further acknowledges that with serious concerns highlighted in a review by the Office of Erie County Comptroller, alarm voiced by the environmental and conservation communities, opposition of elected representatives and residents in the communities affected by logging operations, and questions concerning the proper utilization of the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA), there was unanimous support among members of the Energy & Environment Committee, and also by non-committee members present at a hearing to review "Phase One" and consider advancing "Phase Two," that members unanimously wanted logging operations to stop; and be it further

RESOLVED, That this Legislature hereby instructs the Parks, Recreation and Forestry Department to immediately issue the necessary contractual fourteen-day notice to Hillview Logging Inc., its subcontractors and/or any other entity or entities involved, to stop logging at Erie County Forest Lots 3 and 7, and/or any other Erie County Forest Lots where logging is being conducted, in accordance with provisions for ending a contract between the County of Erie and Hillview Logging Inc., signed on October 8-9, 2005, and recently amended without proper authorization of this Legislature; and be it further

RESOLVED, That this Legislature further instructs the Parks, Recreation and Forestry Department to work with this Legislature and direct that Hillview Logging Inc. stop logging immediately and thereby waive the fourteen-day contractual language so that a gesture of good will can be demonstrated, and that the Parks, Recreation and Forestry Department further work with this Legislature and instruct Hillview Logging Inc. to leave the Erie County Forest in good condition and with respect for the environment and surrounding communities; and be it further

RESOLVED, That this Legislature additionally instructs the Parks, Recreation and Forestry Department to work with this Legislature's Energy & Environment Committee to begin anew "Phase Two" of the Forest Program's logging operations with the intent to provide full transparency and openness, achieve consensus among stakeholders, full utilization and adherence to the SEQRA process with consideration for all environmental and conservation concerns, and a full environmental impact statement should the SEQRA process indicate one is necessary; and be it further

RESOLVED, That this Legislature also instructs the Parks, Recreation and Forestry Department to include language in any "Phase Two" planning to consider a variety of management options for the Erie County Forest, ranging from zero management, up to a sustainable timber production option; and be it further

RESOLVED, That this Legislature further instructs the Parks, Recreation and Forestry Department to ensure that any lead agency chosen for "Phase Two" of the Forest Program's logging operations must prepare and file a notice known as a "Positive Declaration" in the SEQRA process to safeguard communities affected, as well as the environment, concerning any adverse impact that may result from "Phase Two" logging operations; and be it further

RESOLVED, That certified copies of this resolution be forwarded to Erie County Executive Joel A. Giambra; the Erie County Parks, Recreation and Forestry Department; the Erie County Department of Law, and the Office of the Erie County Comptroller.

A RESOLUTION TO BE SUBMITTED BY LEGISLATORS KENNEDY, MARINELLI, WHYTE, IANNELLO, LOUGHRAN and KONST

WHEREAS, according to research conducted by the New York State Energy Research and Development Authority, Erie County consumes 6.62% of the gasoline which is sold in New York State; and

WHEREAS, Erie County pays 6.62% of New York State's federal gasoline tax, which is assessed at the refinery; and

WHEREAS, the federal gasoline tax is returned to each state through several programs, one of which is the Highway Bridge Rehabilitation and Replacement Program; and

WHEREAS, Erie County constitutes approximately 5% of the population of New York State; and

WHEREAS, over the last nine years, Erie County has received an average of only 1.54% of the federal bridge funding apportioned to New York State under the Highway Bridge Rehabilitation and Replacement Program, not 6.62%, which would be commensurate with our contributions to the program, or 5%, which would be commensurate with our population; and

WHEREAS, as a result of only receiving an average 1.54% of the Highway Bridge Rehabilitation and Replacement Program funds over the past nine-years, Erie County has lost approximately \$158 million of funding which could have been used to improved the County's infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, this disparity is part of a larger pattern, exemplified by the funding made available for local projects in the recent State Transportation Bond Act, which set aside only 2.87% for Erie County projects, also well short of the 5% the County should expect by virtue of its population.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Legislature of Erie County hereby memorializes Governor George Pataki and New York State Commissioner of Transportation Thomas Madison that we seek that this disparity be addressed; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Legislature of Erie County seeks that a sum of \$158 million be directed by the New York State Department of Transportation to bridge projects in Erie County - an amount equal to the amount by which Erie County and its constituent municipalities have been shortchanged over the past nine years; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Legislature of Erie County seeks that in the future, HBRR funding be distributed in an equitable manner, and that we receive our fair share; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Legislature of Erie County seeks to see the \$158 million in overdue funding be directed toward the construction of a new bridge or bridges linking downtown Buffalo to Buffalo's Outer Harbor, said bridge being necessary before meaningful private-sector development can occur at the Outer Harbor, and that it be used to address the serious lag in bridge maintenance and replacement throughout the various cities, towns and villages of Erie County; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the clerk of the Legislature shall forward certified copies of this resolution to the Governor of the State of New York, the Commissioner of the State Department of Transportation, and Western New York's State and Federal delegations.

The County of Erie, New York (herein called "County") is hereby authorized to pursuant to and in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 828 of the New York Laws of 1982 and an intermunicipal agreement with the City of Buffalo, is hereby authorized to acquire and construct various infrastructure improvements for the Urban Brownsfields Development Project at the Union Ship Canal Site, in the City of Buffalo, including roads, sewage collection and disposal facilities, solid waste collection and disposal facilities, water supply facilities and drainage facilities. The total estimated maximum cost of said specific objects or purposes, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and to the financing thereof, is \$8,000,000, and said amount is hereby appropriated therefor pursuant to the duly adopted Capital Budget of said County for fiscal year 2006. To the extent that the details set forth in this resolution are inconsistent with any details set forth in the 2006 Capital Budget of the County, such Budget shall be deemed and is hereby amended. The plan of financing includes the issuance of \$2,000,000 bonds herein authorized and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of such bonds, the levy of a tax to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds and notes and application of \$6,000,000 expected to be received from the United States of America and/or the State of New York State of New York to be expended towards the cost thereof or redemption of the bonds or notes issued therefor or to be budgeted as an offset to the taxes for the payment of principal of and interest on said bonds or notes.

Section 2. Bonds of the County in the principal amount of \$2,000,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (herein called "Law"), to finance said appropriation. Section 3. The period of probable usefulness of the specific objects or purposes for which said \$2,000,000 bonds herein authorized are to be issued, within the limitations of Section 11.00 a. 91 of the Law, is fifteen (15) years.

Section 4. The County intends to finance, and the Comptroller of the County is hereby authorized to advance such amounts as are necessary to pay the costs of the object or purpose described in Section 1 hereof prior to the issuance of the bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized out of any available funds of the County, on an interim basis, which amounts are reasonably expected to be reimbursed with the proceeds of debt to be incurred by the County, pursuant to this Resolution, in the maximum amount of bonds herein authorized. This Resolution is a declaration of official intent adopted pursuant to the requirements of Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2.

Section 5. Subject to the provisions of this Resolution and of the Law, and pursuant to the provisions of §30.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bond anticipation notes or the renewals thereof, and of §§50.00, 56.00 to 60.00 and 168.00 of said Law, the powers and duties of the County Legislature relative to authorizing the issuance of any notes in anticipation of the sale of the respective amounts of bonds herein authorized, or the renewals thereof, relative to providing for substantially level or declining annual debt service, relative to prescribing the terms, form and contents and as to the sale and issuance of the respective amounts of bonds herein authorized, and of any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds or the renewals of said notes, and relative to executing agreements for credit enhancement, are hereby delegated to the Comptroller of the County, as the chief fiscal officer of the County.

Section 6. Each of the bonds authorized by this Resolution and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale thereof shall contain the recital of validity prescribed by \$52.00 of said Local Finance Law and said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds

shall be general obligations of the County of Erie, payable as to both principal and interest by general tax upon all the taxable real property within the County without limitation as to rate or amount. WHEREAS, the County Executive's Office, on behalf of the Task Force, has applied to the Fiscal Stability Authority for an efficiency grant to hire an outside, third-party facilitator; and

WHEREAS, during the September 6, 2006 meeting of the Erie County Fiscal Stability Authority, funding for this efficiency grant was approved by the board (ECFSA Resolution No. 06-42); and

WHEREAS, requests for proposals were prepared and responses were received, and the Task Force has tentatively selected the State University of New York at Buffalo Institute for Local Governance and Regional Growth (the "Institute") to assist with implementing alternatives to incarceration; and

WHEREAS, it would benefit the County to immediately initiate the contract with the Institute in order to achieve intended savings as soon as possible.

Release time and stipends effective 2007-2009 Academic Years per Attachment A-2, page 8 (Attachment for 2007-2008 and 2008-2009).

(14) Change to read:

Department chairs shall participate without compensation payment in such college activities as Governance (Committee/Task Forces), Graduation, Advisement, or any other activities during the calendar year as assigned by the Administration of the College up to 40 hours. Participation will be in a minimum of four (4) hour increments for all activities outside the Academic year. Scheduling of the 40 hours will be accounted for and pre-approved by the Assistant Academic Dean. The practice of department chairs teaching one day overload course will continue through this contract.

Add new (15):

No Retrenchment Clause

The College agrees that, during the life of this Agreement, there will be no reduction in staff, due to any changes in the allocation of reduced load. The College will provide all adversely affected members with an alternative assignment to complement their full load. This alternative assignment may consist of, but is not limited to, the following: (where qualified) the assignment of courses in other disciplines, administrative assignments, (e.g., curriculum development, advisement activities, lab activities and research), and retraining.

ARTICLE 21 – INSTRUCTIONAL PREPARATIONS

Add new (4):

There will be no additional compensation for those faculty who agree to teach additional preparations beyond the above-stated limit.

ARTICLE 25 – PART-TIME TEACHING ASSIGNMENTS

Add new (3):

a) Summer Session(s): Faculty members shall not be permitted to teach more than three (3) courses or nine (9) credit hours during any one (1) session, with no more than eighteen (18) credit hours taught during the period between the end of the traditional spring semester and the start of the fall semester.

b) Winter Intersession: Faculty members shall not be permitted to teach more than two (2) courses or six (6) credit hours during intersession (the period between the end of the fall semester and the start of the spring semester).

(Lecture courses and the corresponding lab will be considered one course for the purposes of this article.)

ARTICLE 40 – ACADEMIC CALENDAR AND YEAR:

(6) Add new:

Effective upon ratification/approval of the successor Agreement by all Parties, the President of the College and the President of the Faculty Federation shall each appoint four (4) individuals to an Ad Hoc Committee whose task will be to review and improve the advisement process and propose an appropriate advisement schedule. This Committee will have six (6) months from the date of their first meeting to complete the task and forward the results to the President of the College and the President of the Faculty Federation who must then mutually agree on the final language before it can be implemented and incorporated into the Contract.

ARTICLE 58 – INSURANCE

A(2) Add the following: (This section applies only to individuals hired after approval of the 2005 – 2009 Contract)

- (a) For new employees hired after contract approval of the 2005-2009 contract, the employer shall contribute 85% of the monthly cost of the Core Plan health insurance product.
- (b) If the employee chooses the Enhanced Plan, he or she must pay 15 percent plus the difference between the Enhanced and Core plans.
- (c) If the employee chooses the Value Plan, he or she is entitled to receive one-half of the difference between the Value and Core plans less the 15 percent employee contribution (amount to be placed in a 105H account).

A(10) Add the following: (This section applies only to individuals hired after approval of the 2005 – 2009 Contract)

For new employees hired after contract approval of the 2005-2009 contract, the employer shall pay 75% of the monthly premium Core Plan rate for eligible employees who retire from County service with 1700 hours or less of accumulated sick leave. Employees with other accumulated sick leave shall have their health insurance premiums paid at the following percentages:

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Memorandum of Understanding Agreement

For the 2005 – 2009 FFECC Contract

The attached items of agreement constitute changes to the previous (September 1, 2000 – August 31, 2005) Collective Bargaining Agreement between the FFECC and Erie Community College and Erie County. These changes will be incorporated into the previous Collective Bargaining Agreement dated September 1, 2000 - August 31, 2005.
