COUNTY OF ERIE LOCAL LAW NO. \_\_\_\_\_ - 2007 LOCAL LAW INTRO. NO. 10 – 2007 A LOCAL LAW Amending Article 1804 of the Erie County Charter Entitled "Division on the Status of Women," to Clearly Define the Functions and Duties Under the Charter.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ERIE COUNTY AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Legislative Intent.

When the Charter Revision Commission recommended the creation of the Office of Public Advocacy, nothing in its recommendation suggested that the Commission on the Status of Women should be stripped of its duties and functions that it had operated under for 20 years. At no time did either the Charter Revision Commission or the County Legislature indicate that the Commission on the Status of Women had not fulfilled its intended purpose or duties.

This local law only clarifies the Commission's powers and duties within the Division.

In the current Charter, the newly created Division on the Status of Women is assigned four duties and functions. "Who" is responsible for these duties and functions within the Division and "how" these duties and functions are carried out by the Division are not specified in the current Charter. This local law would define the "who" and "how." Because this local law is consistent with, and does not alter or re-assign powers given under the current Charter, the proposed local law may be approved by the County Legislature without a referendum.

When the Commission on the Status of Women was first created, it was part of the Office of the County Executive. Under the current Charter, the Division is part of the Office of Public Advocacy. The duties and responsibilities once assigned to the County Executive are now assigned to the Commissioner of the Office of Public Advocacy, including the appointment and supervision of the Division's Director. The local law does not alter these provisions.

Section 2. That section 1804 of the Erie County Charter of the County of Erie, New York, adopted pursuant to law, is hereby amended as follows:

Section 1804. Division on the Status of Women. There shall be a division on the status of women. It is hereby declared to be the policy of Erie eounty County, New York, to promote gender equality and to eliminate discrimination in any form that may exist on account of gender; to fully utilize the potential of each citizen, regardless of gender, in order to preserve our democratic way of life; and to provide equal opportunities to all citizens, regardless of gender, in employment, education, health and mental health, housing, senior and social services, and before the law. The director of said division shall be appointed by and shall serve at the pleasure of the commissioner. (Moved to Section 1805) The division shall:

1. Work to ensure that the women of Erie <u>eC</u>ounty participate fully in matters that have an impact on their lives;

- 2. Develop an information system for services relating to the needs of women, and develop other networks and referral programs as necessary;
- 3. Investigate and analyze resources and services available for women within county government and programs funded by the county and recommend measures to coordinate, consolidate or expand those resources and services to provided maximum efficiency;
- 4. Submit an annual report of its activities and recommendations to the county executive and County Legislature.

Section 3. That Section 1805 of the Erie County Charter of the County of Erie, New York is hereby amended to add subsection (1) as follows:

Section 1805.(1) Powers, duties and functions. The powers, duties and functions of the Division on the Status of Women shall be carried out by the advisory commission to said division, the commissioner of public advocacy, and the director of said division.

- a. The advisory commission, on an annual basis, shall set the goals and establish the statement of outcomes and action plan for the division in collaboration with the commissioner and director.
- <u>b.</u> The action plan shall be carried out by the director of the division working in conjunction with the volunteer committees of the commission.
- c. The director of the division shall be appointed by and shall serve at the pleasure of the commissioner. The commissioner shall oversee the expenditure of appropriated county funds, monitor the day-to-day operation of the division, supervise the director, ensure that the outcomes and action plan for the division are carried out and provide, through the office of public advocacy, sufficient clerical support for the division.
- <u>d.</u> The division will prepare an annual report of its accomplishments, including actual action plan objectives and outcomes.

Additions to the Erie County Charter are reflected by <u>underlining</u>. Deletions to the Erie County Charter are reflected by <u>strikethroughs</u>.

Section 4. This local law shall take effect immediately.

WHEREAS, AD Price I LLC and AD Price I Housing Development Fund Corp. is developing housing for very low and low income households (Project), pursuant to Article XI of the New York Private Housing Finance; and

WHEREAS, the project is located in the Willert Park neighborhood, in the City of Buffalo, New York. The housing development will be bounded by Broadway Avenue on the north, Spring Street on the west, Jefferson Avenue on the east, and William Street on the south. The development will contain 55 residential apartment units for very low and low income households; and

WHEREAS, the Erie County Legislature adopted a policy on Payment in Lieu of Taxes (PILOT) on December 16, 1999, and this PILOT is consistent with said policy; and

WHEREAS, in order to make the Project economically feasible for AD Price I LLC to operate the apartments complex it is necessary to obtain tax relief from the County of Erie and the City of Buffalo.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the County Executive is hereby authorized to execute a Payment in Lieu of Taxes (PILOT) Agreement with AD Price I LLC and AD Price I Housing Development Fund Corp. relating to the AD Price Apartments and all other agreements necessary to conclude this Project; and be it further

RESOLVED, that said Agreement shall include an annual PILOT in the amount of taxes dues as set forth on Schedule B attached hereto. Payment under the agreement will be for fifteen (15) years with the County share of each annual payment being twenty-five (25) percent of the total amount; and be it further

RESOLVED, that certified copies of this resolution shall be forwarded to the County Executive, the Director of Budget, Management, and Finance, the Commissioner of the Department of Environment and Planning, the County Comptroller, and the County Attorney. (5-0)

# 4. INTRO 21-9 (2007) AS AMENDED KENNEDY, IANNELLO, MARINELLI, WHYTE, KOZUB, RANZENHOFER, KONST, GRANT, REYNOLDS, MILLS, LOUGHRAN, MAZUR, MILLER-WILLIAMS and LOCKLEAR

WHEREAS, New York State Thruway Authority (NYSTA) collected \$554 million in tolls in 2006 and spent \$331 million operating the Thruway system; and

WHEREAS, the Thruway Authority's Finance and Audit Committee approved a 5% toll increase in 2009 and another 5% increase in 2010; and

WHEREAS, in addition to increasing tolls, the Thruway Authority is embarking on a \$2.7 billion capital borrowing program; and

WHEREAS, the Thruway Authority was built in the 1950s with the promise that the tolls would be eliminated and the Authority dissolved in 1996, when the bonds used to finance construction were paid off; and

WHEREAS, as is typical with Authorities in New York State that operate with very little governmental oversight and often use the issuance of debt to perpetuate their existence, in the early 1990s the Thruway Authority began borrowing billions of dollars, thereby guaranteeing that the Authority and the tolls would remain in place well beyond 1996; and

WHEREAS, the Thruway Authority opted to continue the tolls and accrue more debt rather than phase themselves and the tolls out of existence; and

WHEREAS, the Thruway Authority promised to use \$132 million of the 2005 toll increase for infrastructure improvements in Western New York -the promised investment has not been met; and

WHEREAS, in September 2007, United States Congressman Brian Higgins requested, pursuant to the Freedom of Information Law, information on how the Thruway Authority plans to spend revenue from the recent toll increases and to substantiate the promise of significant capital improvements in Western New York; and

WHEREAS, the Thruway Authority failed to respond to this reasonable request; and

WHEREAS, the Thruway Authority's failure to provide relevant financial information prompted Congressmen Brian Higgins to request that New York State Comptroller Thomas DiNapoli conduct a comprehensive audit of the Thruway Authority's finances.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Erie County Legislature believes in transparency and openness in all areas of government and supports the reform of Public Authorities; and be it further

RESOLVED, that this honorable body respectfully urges the New York State Thruway Authority to provide all requested information to Congressman Brian Higgins; and be it further

RESOLVED, that this honorable body welcomes the New York State comptroller's comprehensive audit of the New York State Thruway Authority; and be it further

RESOLVED, that certified copies of this resolution are to be forwarded to Brian Higgins, Member of Congress; Thomas DiNapoli, New York State Comptroller; and Kathy Hochul, Erie County Clerk. (5-0)

5. COMM. 21E-6 (2007)

COUNTY EXECUTIVE

WHEREAS, in 2002, the Empire State development Corporation ("ESDC") and the County agreed upon a revised development plan for public amenities along the Buffalo waterfront, including the development of a commercial slip, a new naval museum and veterans park and various public spaces, with the intent of supporting heritage tourism and future economic development along the Buffalo waterfront; and

WHEREAS, in 2005 ESDC created the Erie Canal Harbor Development Corporation ("ECHC") and, since its inception, ECHDC, in collaboration with the County and the City of Buffalo, has generally succeeded ESDC as the primary State entity to promote economic development along the Buffalo waterfront and has actively been involved in the planning and redevelopment of additional improvements to the Buffalo waterfront; and

WHEREAS, the Memorial Auditorium, a public facility owned by the City of Buffalo, is situated on a parcel along the Buffalo waterfront and has been vacant for over ten years, and the Memorial auditorium parcel is a critical location for any plan to redevelop the Buffalo waterfront; and

WHEREAS, the Erie County Fiscal Stability Authority (ECFSA) has imposed certain conditions on its approval of the contract between the County of Erie and Plymouth Tax Services for the sale of the County's 2006 and subsequent years' delinquent tax liens; and

WHEREAS, these conditions include requiring the County to use the proceeds from the sale of the 2007 tax liens to reduce the size of the County's 2007 Capital Budget borrowing, and allowing the ECFSA to do such borrowing on behalf of the County; and

WHEREAS, if the County is unable to close on the contract between the County and Plymouth Tax Services, the County's 2007 and 2008 operating budgets will be severely impacted to the detriment of County taxpayers; and

WHEREAS, if the County's 2007 Capital Budget borrowing does not take place, regardless of whether it is done by the ECFSA or by the County Comptroller, critical public improvements will not take place to the detriment of County residents; and

WHEREAS, if the County is not able to use the proceeds from the sale of the 2007 tax liens to restore the County's fund balance the County's ability to borrow funds in the future will be negatively impacted; and

WHEREAS, the current stalemate reflects badly on the ability of both the County and the ECFSA to fulfill their public duty to serve the best interests of our community and to move our County forward in a fiscally sound manner; and

WHEREAS, a compromise is needed to resolve this stalemate.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Erie County Legislature does hereby declare that there is a financial necessity for the Erie County Fiscal Stability Authority to undertake the borrowing for the County's 2007 Capital Budget and this Honorable Body does hereby request the ECFSA to do the borrowing on behalf of the County before December 31, 2007 in accordance with the adopted bond resolutions heretofore submitted by the Erie County Comptroller to the ECFSA, such a declaration and request being made contingent on the specific condition that the ECFSA revise its authorizing resolution for the contract between the County and Plymouth Tax Services to remove all conditions with respect to the use by the County of the proceeds from such contract and to not add additional conditions; and be it further
