WHEREAS, in 2003, the New York State Legislature adopted a Home Rule Message from the Erie County Legislature to create the Erie County Medical Center Corporation (ECMCC). Public Authorities Law, Article 10-C, Title 6, Section 3628 (1) (b), specifically empowers this Legislative Body to recommend three individuals to the Governor for appointment to the ECMCC Board of Directors; and

WHEREAS, subsequent Legislatures of the County of Erie have followed Local Law No. 5 (2003) when recommending persons to serve as ECMCC directors; and

WHEREAS, it is the power of Local Law No.5 (2003) that has provided the Legislature with fairness and equity: "It has been the historic experience of this Honorable Body that an equitable distribution of recommendations between the Majority and Minority Caucuses of the Erie County Legislature to a board or commission will ensure that both the Majority and Minority Caucuses are properly represented," the Law states; and

WHEREAS, Frank B. Mesiah has served with distinction as a member of the ECMCC Board of Directors, and has been an active and contributing director with a deep understanding and appreciation for the important work of the hospital, as well as ECMCC's core mission; and Mr. Mesiah has demonstrated an ability to serve and contribute to the critical work of the Board; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Mesiah's term as a director has expired, and he has expressed a strong desire to continue serving the community in this capacity - and it is noteworthy that Mr. Mesiah enjoyed unanimous support for appointment in the previous recommendation to the Governor by this Legislature.

WHEREAS, Erie County is also home to the Buffalo-Niagara International airport; and

WHEREAS, Erie County and the City of Buffalo are home to over one million residents, our region has been growing economically for the past several years with both public and private

investments, and we are located less than a two hour drive from Toronto and a one hour flight from New York City; and

WHREREAS, an Amazon headquarters located in Erie County would be an incredible boost to the entire region and would continue the positive growth we have seen here; and

WHEREAS, this Honorable body finds that Erie County's regional development groups have been working to attract new business to our area and have so far been successful. We hope that progress continues and our development groups think big and look towards attracting Amazon as their next move.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Erie County Legislature hereby encourages Amazon to locate their HQ2 here in Erie County; and, be it further
