# **COUNTY EXECUTIVE**

WHEREAS, the Department has been awarded \$109,000 in 100% State share funds to continue and enhance a program entitled Safe Harbor for Exploited Children; and

WHEREAS, potential and sudden marketplace changes and/or other events in the sometimes tenuous local and national ambulance industry could result in a public health emergency such that Erie County might have the need to emergently develop ambulance transport capability or, more likely, contract for such services from commercial vendors to service the citizens of Erie County.

### NOW, THEREFORE BE IT

RESOLVED, that Erie County shall apply for a Municipal Certificate of Need for an ALS-FR service covering all of Erie County as prescribed in New York State Public Health Law Article 30, section 3008; and be it further

RESOLVED; that the funding received for any Direct Care Cost of Living Adjustments will be used solely to support salary and salary-related fringe benefit increases for direct care staff, direct support professionals, clinical staff, and eligible foster parents and adoptive parents; and be it further;

RESOLVED; that this action is conducted pursuant to Subdivision 3-d of section 1 of part C of chapter 57 of the laws of 2006, as added by L. 2014, chapter 60, Part I, Section 2 (paragraph (i)) and the applicable standards issued by DOH; and be it further

# EC REAL PROPERTY TAX SERVICES

**AS AMENDED** 

WHEREAS, the Erie County Director of Real Property Tax Services has received applications for corrected tax billings and / or refunds for taxes previously paid in accordance with New York State Real Property Tax Law sections 554 and 556; and

Recommendation to ECL regarding the Level 3RP-554 and RP-556 Applications Petitioners, Level 3 Communications, LLC and Broadwing Communications filed Applications for Refund and Credit of Real Property Taxes on form RP-556 (attached) relative to the various properties listed below for various years. Each Application purportedly applies to "fiber optic cables and inclosures on private rights of way". The petitioner alleges, in addenda attached to each Application, that the assessments in issue were made upon personal property excluded from taxable real property because the fiber optic cable at issue is "not for electrical conductors and therefore they cannot be taxed under RPTL". They base this assertion on a holding in <u>Matter of RCN</u>, a First Department case, whose holding has been rejected by a recent decision in our Judicial District, <u>Level 3 Communications, LLC vs. County of Erie et al</u> (copy attached). The addenda further allege that the taxes at issue were assessed based

upon an "unlawful entry" pursuant to RPTL §550(7)(c). That section of the RPTL provides that an assessment is unlawful where it has been made by a person or body without the authority to make the assessment.

I have conducted an investigation of each Application and have determined that pursuant to Level 3 Communications, LLC vs. County of Erie et al, the fiber optic cable at issue is taxable as real property pursuant to RPTL 102(12)(f). Additionally, the assessors each had the authority to make such an assessment and therefore, the assessments were not "unlawful entries" pursuant to RPTL §550(7)(c). Accordingly, it is my recommendation that this Honorable Body deny each of the Applications based upon the foregoing.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that petitions numbered 215206 through 215226 , inclusive be hereby denied based upon the recommendation of the Director of Real Property Tax Services and be charged back to the applicable towns and/or cities.

Subdivision (d) of section twelve of the Erie County Sales and Use Tax Resolution being a resolution adopted by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Erie being Item 8 of Meeting Number 31, held on July 27, 1965, Supervisors Proceedings, Page 666, as amended, is amended to read as follows:

- (d) The provision for refund or credit described in section 1119(d) of the New York Tax Law, relating to qualified empire zone enterprises, qualified entities that are also tenants in or part of a New York State innovation hot spot, and to businesses located in an approved tax-free NY area, shall apply to the taxes imposed by this enactment.
- Section 2. This resolution shall take effect March 1, 2016, and shall apply in accordance with applicable transitional provisions in sections 1106 and 1217 of the New York Tax Law.

# **COUNTY EXECUTIVE**

WHEREAS, FEMA aid was made available to Erie County for the November 2014 winter storm Knife disaster on behalf of various Fire Departs throughout the county (COMM. 14E-6 (2015)) at 75% of the total storm expenditures, along with the possibility of the remaining 25% being reimbursed by the State; and

WHEREAS, Fire Departments are required to submit to the County invoices and proof of payment for their allowable claims consistent with FEMA guidelines prior to receiving their FEMA and possible State reimbursements; and

WHEREAS, the Newton Abbott Fire Department had extensive curb damage which they are unable to repair under their current budget and are requesting an advance of their 75% FEMA reimbursement, and their possible 25% State reimbursement if the County should receive that, based on the three quotes provided to the County; and

WHEREA, the Newton Abbott Fire Department will be required to submit invoices and proof of payment once the work is completed; and

WHEREAS, the Newton Abbott Fire Department is solely responsible for subsequent FEMA audits and compliance issues and not the County of Erie; and

WHEREAS, the Newton Abbott Fire Department will be responsible for repaying any reimbursements, repayments or liabilities subsequently identified by any audit, with no liability accruing to Erie County.
