## A RESOLUTION TO BE SUBMITTED BY LEGISLATOR MORTON

WHEREAS, Route 78 (Transit Road) is a vital section of road that spans the entire county from Lockport and East Amherst to West Seneca and East Aurora passing through many of our towns and villages on the way; and

WHEREAS, as it runs through Depew, Cheektowaga, and Lancaster the Transit corridor contains an exceptionally narrow segment of road between French Road and Gould Avenue where four deteriorating bridges crossing Transit limit the width of the road; and

WHEREAS, the narrow width of Route 78 at this location and the limited shoulder area makes this section of Transit dangerous for pedestrians, difficult to snow plow, and impossible for first responders to navigate despite being a highly trafficked area; and

WHEREAS, the New York State Department of Transportation is responsible for repair and maintenance of this vital thoroughfare and have estimated the cost to remove the bridges and redesign the road to be between \$50 and \$60 million; and

WHEREAS, the Erie County Industrial Development Agency is currently responsible for one of the unused bridges spanning Transit Road and will be conducting badly needed maintenance on an unused bridge this summer; and

WHEREAS, Erie County is the lone stakeholder yet to weigh in with the Village of Depew, the Town of Lancaster, the Town of Cheektowaga, and the Town Highway Superintendents' Association of Erie County having all passed resolutions urging the Department of Transportation to increase funding to this section of Route 78.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that this honorable body hereby urges New York State to take action on the widening of Route 78 in the interest of public safety and in support of the businesses that operate in that area; and, be it further

WHEREAS, New York State Senate bill S879B, introduced by Senator Ortt, would repeal a portion of the NY Secure Ammunition and Firearms Enforcement (SAFE) Act of 2013; and

WHEREAS, this Legislative Body has long advocated for the right to bear arms as afforded by the Constitution and has opposed the imposition of the SAFE Act as an infringement of that right; and

WHEREAS, the SAFE Act was rushed through the legislative process and passed without following proper procedure; and

WHEREAS, sections of the SAFE Act have benefitted the community, including the strengthening of Kendra's Law and Mark's Laws, and increasing the protection of privacy for lawful permit holders, and those provisions should remain, however, the SAFE Act offers little in the way of solutions for its main goal of deterring gun violence; and

WHEREAS, the burden of complying with much the SAFE Act falls on law abiding gun owners, and provisions like the five-year recertification create unnecessary bureaucracy without improving the safety of New York State residents; and

WHEREAS, Erie County faces a financial impact during each five-year recertification process and forces additional burden on taxpayers; and

WHEREAS, many of those most impacted by the SAFE Act are individuals that reside outside of New York City in areas where hunting and sport shooting are common occurrences; and

WHEREAS, Senator Ortt has introduced a bill that will protect the positive aspects of the SAFE Act while limiting the overly bureaucratic and financially burdensome sections that only serve to limit the Constitutional rights of law abiding residents of New York.

WHEREAS, The Great Lakes are the single greatest source of surface freshwater in the world. Every day over 12 million people rely on Lake Erie as a clean, safe, and reliable source of fresh water. Keeping Lake Erie in this condition has historically proven difficult, as lawmakers have not prioritized adequate conservation strategies to ensure this vital resource can continue on for generations to come; and

WHEREAS, the public outcry in the 1970s over the condition of the Great Lakes is part of the environmental movement that led to the Clean Water Act of 1972 as well as the Environmental Protection Agency. Clean water is not a partisan issue, but rather one all residents of Western New York should support. Federal funds from the Environmental Protection Agency are critical to the completed restoration of the Buffalo River, Niagara River, Scajaquada Creek, Outer Harbor and Lake Erie; and

WHEREAS, in addition to the safety and quality of life concerns regarding EPA funding, it will also be a major economic detriment to Western New York's economy if these federal funds are cut. The EPA and environmental project investment in Western New York is in the hundreds of millions of dollars. These funds contribute to supporting eco-tourism in the region as well as drinking water protections, eliminating sewer overflows, and recreational fishing; and

WHEREAS, we must ensure the continued existence of the Great Lakes Restoration Initiative, a key piece of legislation that is administered by the Environmental Protection Agency through the Great Lakes National Program Office. This initiative targets the most eminent threats to the health and vitality of the Great Lakes and will continue to build on past success; and

WHEREAS, we recall what happened to the City of Toledo in 2014 when toxic algae forced the city to shut off water to over 400,000 residents over the course of two days. The City of Toledo's economy took a beating during this ordeal. We cannot allow such events to happen in Western New York; and

WHEREAS, this legislative body voices its concern over the intent of the Trump Administration to eliminate the Clean Water Rule- a rule put in place to ensure incidents like those in Toledo do not occur again.
