WHEREAS, the Department of Senior Services, applied in the summer of 2017 to the New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT) for Section 5310 Enhanced Mobility of Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities federal grant funding for the operation of the Department's Going Places Transportation Program; and

WHEREAS, the Going Places program provides older adults, who have no other means of transportation, with rides to medical appointments, grocery shopping, and senior centers for congregate meals, with the Department of Senior Services performing the central dispatch function for the program in partnership with Erie County municipalities and subcontracted transportation service providers; and

WHEREAS, NYSDOT has recently awarded the Department, Section 5310 Enhanced Mobility Grant funding under three categories:

- 1) Vehicle Purchases \$39,907 to cover 80% of the purchase price of a replacement mini
- 2) Mobility Management \$121,161 to reimburse 80% of the Department's transportation dispatch unit's payroll costs.
- 3) Operating Assistance \$174,000 to reimburse, up to 50% of the costs of Going Places' wheelchair and other rides.

and

WHEREAS, the mobility management and operating assistance grant is for the period October 1, 2018 to December 31, 2019, while the vehicle funds are for the period October 1, 2018 through September 30, 2024, which covers it's expected useful life; and

WHEREAS, NYSDOT will retain the \$39,907 awarded for the vehicle and use the monies to purchase the mini-bus for the Department of Senior Services through a NY State Office of General Services purchasing contract; and

WHEREAS, NYSDOT requires the Department of Senior Services to enter into a Local Funding and Depository Agreement to open an interest-bearing account at U.S. Bank National Association and deposit \$11,473 into the account which represents the required 20% local share of the mini-bus plus a 15% contingency amount to cover possible price increases; and

WHEREAS, NYSDOT will withdraw the monies from the bank account to cover the actual 20% local share cost, with unused monies remaining in the account to be returned to the Department of Senior Services once the vehicle is delivered; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Senior Services proposes to use 2017 capital funds from the approved 2017 Purchase of Replacement Vans, capital project #A.17027 to fund the 20% local share of the mini-bus; and

WHEREAS, no additional County funds are required to secure this new grant funding as the Department has identified transportation appropriations in the Areawide Agency on Aging (Title III-B2019), and New York State AAA Transportation Program (AAATRAN1920), and Community Services for the Elderly (CSE1920) grants that will provide the required local match for the mobility management and operating assistance funding.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the County Executive be and is hereby authorized to contract with the NYSDOT to accept the Section 5310 Enhanced Mobility of Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities grant funding for the mobility management and operating assistance for the period October 1, 2018 to December 31, 2019, and for the Capital Vehicle Purchase for the October 1, 2018 to September 30, 2024 period; and be it further

WHEREAS, the Department of Public Works looks to constantly improve and enhance its roll throughout Erie County by providing open and consistent access to infrastructure across every city, town, and village throughout the county; and

WHEREAS, the Division of Fleet Services owns and maintains electric cars, and the market for electric vehicles has been rising throughout the country; and

WHEREAS, charging stations serve as means to attract additional visitors to the Erie County parks system; and

WHEREAS, New York State Energy Research and Development (NYSERDA) identified regions across the state that did not have sufficient Electronic Vehicle (EV) infrastructure and responded by incentivizing municipalities to install charging stations; and

WHEREAS, the NYSERDA funded program allows for the total cost of up to approximately \$8,000 per charging station, as well as installation, to be covered for partnering cities, towns and counties; and

WHEREAS, a requirement of receiving the grant and the station is that the station be powered and the usage reported for four (4) years, of which the contract with Plug-In Stations Online includes the first year software license therefore an additional three (3) years of software license will need to be purchased at a cost not to exceed \$8,000; and

WHEREAS, the County is required to upfront the costs associated with the acquisition and installation of the stations; and

WHEREAS, the County has received confirmation from NYSERDA that \$144,000 in funding for the project has already been green lit for the proposed list of sites, which is 100% of the costs of the stations, shipping and installation (\$4,000-\$8,000 per station) once all of the requirements have been met with the installation.

WHEREAS, the Erie County Sheriff's Office (ECSO) needs to utilize telephone funds to purchase needed equipment for the Erie County Holding Center's (ECHC) kitchen; and

WHEREAS, the ECHC kitchen prepares and serves over 1,000 meals per day, seven days a week, 365 days a year; and

WHEREAS, the standard set forth by the New York State Commission of Correction is that agencies must provide a minimum of one hot meal per day; and

WHEREAS, many of the pieces of the kitchen equipment are over 20-years-old and are malfunctioning with increasing frequency; and

WHEREAS, the ECHC is operating with one working oven while the second oven waits for additional service and repair; and

WHEREAS, the ECSO needs to replace two new convection ovens, a refrigerator, a tilting skillet/braising pan, two microwave ovens, a hot-food serving counter, utility serving counter, a cold-food serving counter; and

WHEREAS, to provide more "scratch meals," the ECSO is purchasing two stainless steel preparation tables, two fruit and vegetable slicers, and two can openers; and

WHEREAS, the kitchen also needs a new conveyor dishwasher, two microwave ovens, kitchen utensils, and waste disposal equipment; and

WHEREAS, the Erie County Sheriff's Office would utilize Telephone Revenue funds to purchase the necessary kitchen equipment which will eliminate any burden to the taxpayer or affect the 2019 Erie County Budget; and

WHEREAS, the Sheriff and the County Executive agree the aforementioned items are necessary for the operation of the ECHC; and

WHEREAS, these purchases comply with COMM. 6E-24, 2013, which states that telephone revenue "shall be dedicated to the general operation of the Holding Center and Correctional facility"; and

WHEREAS, as of April 22, 2019, the Telephone Revenue account has a balance of \$578,787.00; and

WHEREAS, this resolution transfers \$100,000.00 from the Telephone Revenue account and this resolution will not have any impact on the 2019 County Budget.
