WHEREAS, Erie County has begun a pilot program to link persons to medication assisted treatment (MAT) after non-fatal overdoses and before they have a chance to occur; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Health and Human Services has decided to fund an expansion of the MATTERSNY linkage to MAT in Erie County for first responder and peer referral after an overdose situation; and

WHEREAS, this program will allow the Erie County Department of Health to support local first responder outreach to individuals with opioid use disorder to address the challenge of repeat overdoses through linkage to treatment on the spot and connection to a peer in recovery for ongoing support; and

WHEREAS, the University of Buffalo Primary Care Research Institute (PCRI) has agreed to continue evaluation efforts on the project; and

WHEREAS, this grant in the amount of \$2,000,000 and requires no local funding.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

WHEREAS, the said Local Law requires that the mall corporation present an annual budget to the Legislature regarding the amount to be raised by mall district special charges; and WHEREAS, pursuant to the said Local Law, Buffalo Place Inc. held a public hearing, on due notice to property owners within the district, regarding the proposed 2023 annual budget on October 25, 2022; and

WHEREAS, on October 30, 2013 the Board of Directors of Buffalo Place Inc. approved a resolution approving a payment in lieu of service charges for the HSBC Atrium Building and have included the same as part of its proposed 2023 budget.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

WHEREAS, after a review of the three submitted proposals, as well as a site visit to a Ricoh installation to see the potential replacement equipment in production; and

WHEREAS, the College has utilized Xerox equipment for approximately the last 20 years, it was the College's recommendation to continue its relationship with Xerox through a Document Management Agreement with ComDoc, Inc., a Xerox Company for a five-year lease; and

WHEREAS, in the past several years, we have seen the average monthly lease expense reduced from \$27,000 for the lease ending in 2017 to approximately \$13,500 per month for the lease now expiring, and then down to \$2,772 monthly for this new five-year lease; and

WHEREAS, the base equipment expense with service charge is \$33,264 per year, and the Cost per copy charges will be as follows per unit: (1) Xerox Versant 4100 and Fiery Controller-\$0.028 per color copy up to 13" by 19", \$0.0029 per black and white copy up to 13" by 19", \$0.058 per extra-large color copy, (2) Xerox PrimeLink B9125 Digital Black/White Press- \$0.0029 per

black and white copy; (3) Xerox PrimeLink B9125 Digital Black/White Press- \$0.0029 per black and white copy, (4) Xerox PrimeLink C9070 Light Production Color Press- \$0.028 per color copy and \$0.0029 per black and white color copy; and
