WHEREAS, in order to keep the Legislature's annual departmental budget in accordance with the Erie County Charter, the Legislature needs the authority to hire staff at a variable minimum.

WHEREAS, beginning on December 23, 2022 a massive blizzard descended upon our region with wind gusts of over 70 mph and blizzard conditions for almost 48 hours; and

WHEREAS, County, State and local governments responded to provide snow removal and emergency response assistance to residents; and

WHEREAS, the County is currently working with State and local officials to become eligible for Federal and State disaster assistance funding; and

WHEREAS, the initial budget will be funded at county cost but will be adjusted once eligibility for Federal and State aid is clearly determined; and

WHEREAS, preliminary estimates of cost to be incurred by Erie County alone for the December blizzard will be approximately \$7-\$10 million; and

WHEREAS, funding for all local share costs can be derived from known 2022 savings in MMIS-Medicaid costs; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that the most effective way to track revenue and expenses related to the blizzard for possible reimbursement purposes is to create a new Fund.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Eric County Legislature hereby authorizes the establishment of the December 2022 Blizzard Fund – Fund 255 in the amount of no more than \$10 million in order to effectively track revenue and expense related to the December blizzard; and be it further

RESOLVED, that authorization is hereby given to the Director of Budget & Management to make any and all required budgetary adjustments to properly record expense and account for all additions or reductions in Federal, State, or other revenues that are made available related to the December 2022 Blizzard response efforts; and be it further

RESOLVED, that certified copies of this resolution be forwarded to the County Executive's Office, the Comptroller's Office, the Division of Budget & Management, and the Department of Law.
