# 4. COMM. 17E-9 (2024) COUNTY EXECUTIVE

WHEREAS, the County Legislature of the County of Erie, New York (herein called the "County Legislature" and the "County," respectively), on behalf of the Erie County Sewer District No. 3 in the County (the "District") and pursuant to proceedings heretofore had and taken in accordance with the provisions of Article 5-A of the County Law, including approving orders of the State Comptroller, has established the District; and

WHEREAS, the County identified the need to undertake a substantial sewer system capital improvements project to the Southtowns Advanced Wastewater Treatment Facility; and

WHEREAS, on July 20, 2023 the County Legislature adopted a certain bond resolution entitled:

BOND RESOLUTION OF THE LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF ERIE, NEW YORK (THE "COUNTY"), AUTHORIZING THE INCREASE AND IMPROVEMENT OF THE FACILITIES OF ERIE COUNTY SEWER DISTRICT NO. 3 (THE "PROJECT"), STATING THE TOTAL ESTIMATED MAXIMUM COST OF THE PROJECT TO BE \$100,000,000, APPROPRIATING SUCH AMOUNT THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF UP TO \$100,000,000 OF BONDS OR OTHER OBLIGATIONS OF THE COUNTY (COLLECTIVELY, THE "OBLIGATIONS") TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION; AND FURTHER AUTHORIZING ANY AMOUNTS RECEIVED FROM THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA AND/OR THE STATE OF NEW YORK OR ANY OTHER SOURCE FOR THE PROJECT TO BE EXPENDED TOWARDS THE COST OF THE PROJECT AS INDICATED HEREIN, OR TOWARDS THE REDEMPTION OF ANY OF THE OBLIGATIONS ISSUED THEREFOR, OR TO BE BUDGETED AS AN OFFSET TO THE TAXES FOR PAYMENT OF THE PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON THE OBLIGATIONS.

WHEREAS, the cost of such project has increased due to major inflationary pressures, material and labor shortages as well as an overall increase in the cost of the project due to these factors; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Managers of the District has duly directed that there be prepared an updated map, plan and report and revised estimate of cost (as so revised and updated, the "Report" and the "Estimate" respectively and, collectively, the "Report and Estimate") by the County Engineers (i.e., the Erie County Department of Environment and Planning) relating to a proposed increase and improvement of the facilities of the District, which Report and Estimate have been approved by the Board of Managers of the District on April 17, 2024, and subsequent thereto

the Report and Estimate were filed with the County Legislature pursuant to Section 268 of the County Law; and

WHEREAS, the Report and Estimate describe a proposed increase and improvement of the facilities of the District, generally consisting of improvements to the Southtowns Advanced Wastewater Treatment Facility, existing pumping stations, and the sanitary sewer collection system; as more fully described in the Report and Estimate (collectively, "Improvements" or the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, such Project will generally consist of substantial improvements to the Southtowns Advanced Wastewater Treatment Facility, such work being currently anticipated to include, but not necessarily be limited to, disinfection and effluent pumping improvements, ORF and outfall modifications, bioclarifier and aeration/UNOX system improvements including the rehabilitation of existing tanks, solids handling improvements, electrical improvements, equipment replacements and upgrades to backup power generator(s), IT infrastructure and HVAC system improvements, as well as other upgrades that are identified in the additional facility needs evaluation and as more fully identified in (or contemplated by) the Report, with the foregoing to include all necessary site work, equipment, apparatus and other improvements and costs incidental thereto and in connection with the financing thereof; and

WHEREAS, the increased maximum estimated cost of the Project is \$215,000,000, and unless paid for from other sources or charges, such cost will be apportioned among the benefitted real properties in the District in accordance with charges based on usage and/or special assessments based on units, assessed value and/or footage, as these or other applicable cost apportionment standards may be specified in the District's Benefit and User Charge formulas (as those currently exist or as they may be amended from time to time in accordance with the County's sewer rents local law and the rules and procedures adopted by the Board of Managers of the District); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the County Law the consent of the State Comptroller is required prior to the construction and development of the Project in the District because the cost thereof to the Typical Property (as defined in the County Law) is estimated to exceed the Average Estimated Cost to the Typical Property for similar types of projects, as computed by the State Comptroller, with such cost being estimated to be \$221; and

WHEREAS, the County Legislature has given due consideration to the impact that the Project may have on the environment and, on the basis of such consideration, the County Legislature found that no substantial adverse environmental impact will be caused thereby; and

WHEREAS, the County Legislature and the County have complied in every respect with all applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations regarding environmental matters, including compliance with the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act, comprising Article 8 of the Environmental Conservation Law and, in connection therewith, duly issued a negative declaration and/or other applicable documentation concerning the project, which has been filed in the office of the County Clerk; and

WHEREAS, the County Legislature adopted Resolution No. 113-2024 on July 25, 2024, calling a meeting of the County Legislature for the purpose of holding a public hearing on the proposed Project in accordance with the Report and Estimate (the "Public Hearing"); and

WHEREAS, such Resolution No. 113-2024 authorized and directed the Clerk of the County Legislature to publish the notice of the Public Hearing; and

WHEREAS, the Public Hearing was duly held at County Hall, in Buffalo, New York, on September 9, 2024, at 2:00 o'clock P.M., Prevailing Time; and

WHEREAS, notice of the Public Hearing was duly published and filed in the manner provided by law and proof thereof was submitted to the County Legislature.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF ERIE, NEW YORK, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Upon the evidence given at the Public Hearing, it is hereby found and determined that it is in the public interest to proceed with the Project and its proposed plan of financing, all as more fully described in the preambles hereto, and the Project is hereby authorized in concept (subject to the County's obtaining the required approval of the New York State Comptroller) at an increased maximum estimated cost of \$215,000,000.

<u>Section 2</u>. It is hereby found and determined that the parcels and lots of the District shall be benefited by the Project.

Section 3. It is hereby found and determined that the maximum estimated cost of the Project is \$215,000,000, and unless paid for from other sources or charges, such cost to be to be apportioned among the benefitted real properties in the District in accordance with charges based on usage and/or special assessments based on units, assessed value and/or footage, as these or other applicable cost apportionment standards may be specified in the District's Benefit and User Charge formulas (as those currently exist or as they may be amended from time to time in accordance with the County's sewer rents local law and the rules and procedures adopted by the Board of Managers of the District).

Section 4. It is hereby found and determined that the cost of the Project shall be financed by the issuance of serial bonds of the County (to be issued pursuant to one or more bond resolutions that are to be adopted by the Legislature in the future) in an amount not to exceed \$215,000,000, and with the balance of the cost of the Project to be annually apportioned within the District as described previously herein.

<u>Section 5</u>. It is hereby found and determined that this resolution shall constitute the declaration (or reaffirmation) of the County's "official intent" to reimburse (to the extent permitted) expenditures toward the Project with the proceeds of bonds, notes or other obligations, as required by United States Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2.

<u>Section 6</u>. It is hereby found and determined that the County Legislature has directed that an application for approval be prepared and submitted to the New York State Comptroller's office,

believes the contents of the application to be accurate, has determined that the Project (and its proposed plan of financing) for which approval is being sought is in the public interest and will not constitute an undue burden on the properties which will bear the cost thereof, and if the cost of the proposed improvements is to be assessed in whole or in part against a benefited area, that all real property to be so assessed will be benefited by the proposed improvements and that no benefited property has been excluded. The Legislature understands that the attached application has been presented and approved in substantially complete and final form, but nevertheless authorizes and approves, in advance, such non-material modifications, amendments or revisions as may, in the opinion of the County Attorney and the County's bond counsel, be deemed appropriate.

Section 7. It is hereby directed that within ten (10) days after adoption of this Resolution, the Clerk of the County Legislature shall record with the Clerk of the County a copy of this Resolution, certified by the Clerk of the County Legislature.

Section 8. It is hereby directed that this resolution shall take effect immediately.

WHEREAS, the Erie County Department of Personnel has identified the need for continued third-party administration services to manage critical employee benefits programs, including Health Flexible Spending Accounts (HFSA), Dependent Care Assistant Accounts, Adoption Assistance Account, Parking and Transit Accounts, Health Reimbursement Accounts (HRA), COBRA Administration, and Retiree Billing Services; and

WHEREAS, an open request for proposals (RFP) was issued in accordance with County policy to identify a qualified provider for these services; and

WHEREAS, a committee comprised of representatives from the Comptroller's Office and the Personnel Department was convened to review the proposals submitted in response to the RFP; and

WHEREAS, after a thorough evaluation process, P&A Group was the consensus choice of the committee, based on their expertise, cost-effective service offerings, and their ability to meet the needs of Erie County's employee benefits program; and

WHEREAS, the agreed-upon pricing for these services is as follows:

- Health Flexible Spending Accounts: \$2.50 Price per Participant per Month (PPPM)
- Dependent Care Assistant Accounts: \$2.50 PPPM
- Adoption Assistance Account: \$2.50 PPPM
- Parking and Transit Accounts: \$2.50 PPPM
- Health Reimbursement Accounts: \$2.50 PPPM
- Retiree Billing: \$3.75 PPPM
- COBRA Administration: \$0.39 per eligible employee per month.

and

WHEREAS, the term of this contract will be for three (3) years, with an option for two (2) one-year extensions, providing stability and continuity in the administration of these critical benefits; and

WHEREAS, the contract costs are allocated per participant per month based on the services utilized via available funding in the 2025 Personnel Budget Professional Services, with flexible spending accounts generating net savings for Erie County due to payroll tax (FICA) reductions; and

WHEREAS, failure to authorize this contract would result in significant operational challenges, including the need to develop costly internal capabilities to manage these services, potential inefficiencies, and the risk of non-compliance with federal regulation.

RESOLVED, that the Erie County Legislature hereby authorizes the County Executive or Deputy County Executive to enter into a contract with Priselac & Associates (P&A) Group for the provision of Third-Party Administration Services, effective January 1, 2025, for a term of three (3) years, with an option for two (2) one-year extensions; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the County Executive or Deputy County Executive is hereby authorized to execute all necessary documents to effectuate this contract; and be it further
