

ERIE COUNTY COVID-19 CASE DATA


As a reminder, the information on the PowerPoint is current only as of the date of the presentation (unless otherwise noted).

- 9,022 total positive cases (264,198 specimens tested)
- 676 people have died.
 - These were all lab-confirmed cases.
 - There are NO presumed positive cases.
- On August 17, there were 25 individuals admitted to Erie County hospitals for COVID-19.
- 6 individuals were in the ICU and 2 individuals had an airway assist.



ERIE COUNTY HOSPITALIZATION DATA: AUGUST 17




 Hospitalization totals remain stable in the 20's over the past two weeks






