

Monday, June 16th @ 2:00pm - General Bennett Riley Defender of Buffalo

Thomas F. Schobert, author of "Hush the Cannon's Roar - The Life and Times of Bennet Riley: Defender of Buffalo", will discuss the career and personal life of Major General Bennet C. Riley, who served in the U.S. Army for 40 years from the War of 1812 through the Mexican War and culminated with his serving as the last military governor of California during the famous "California Gold Rush". In the early 1840s, Riley was commanding officer of the Buffalo Barracks, an army post located on what is now the Theodore Roosevelt Inaugural Site. The experience of Riley during his time here and his interactions with notable Buffalonians convinced him to return here after his military service was finished.

Wednesday, June 25th @ 1:15 pm - Gardens of Murder Creek

The restoration efforts at our gardens (Gardens at Murder Creek) focus on restoring the Great Lakes ecosystem on just under 10 acres. The property, a former horse pasture, was purchased in 2008 and restoration efforts in 2010. Our mission included the removal of invasive exotics, increased biodiversity of Great Lakes native plants, and stabilized the banks of our seasonally flooded creek bed.So far our efforts have transformed the landscape and we have begun cataloging the results of our efforts in terms of insects, birds, and mammals. More work is needed but restoration takes time. Our primary goal has always been to demonstrate what restoring native plants would mean to the community.
