# Newstead Town Board Meeting - August 11, 2025

A public hearing was called to order by the Newstead Town Board on August 11, 2025, at 7:25pm at the Newstead Town Hall.

Roll Call was taken with all board members present.

The Supervisor called the public hearing to order Local Law 2 of the Year 2025 titled 2025 Rezoning of Real Property and Zoning Map Amendment for a parcel at 5725 Davison Road.

The Clerk read proof of publication, and the Supervisor opened the floor for public comment.

Supervisor Izydorczak gave a history of this property and why the request is being made.

<u>Stan Serwon, 5759 Davison Road -</u> asked if all the property is going to be zoned C-2 and it will not be. Mr. Kelkenberg wants to rebuild the structure that burned before he purchased the property and needs the zoning amended to be able to do that.

There being no further comments, a motion was made by Councilman Dugan, seconded by Councilman Mutter to close the public hearing at 7:33pm.

A notice from the NYS DOT was received from Allen Kidder at the Akron Airport informing them their application to construct a new T-hangar at the Akron Airport has been approved for funding through the 2024 Airport Investment and Revitalization for New York capital grant program.

A letter from Kristina Sanner, Akron Youth Football & Cheer, was received thanking the Town Officials for the continued support and access to Veterans Park for the programs over the last 25 years.

**Highway** – a report was presented by the Highway Superintendent as follows: the crews swept Roll, Clair & Kathryn, field ditch mowing completed and removed fallen trees in ditches, trimmed guard rails, filled hole at end of N Ayers Rd., replaced street signs on Schutt and Stage, repairs to TS 90 (compressor) and JD5100, one truck to Lancaster, removed 2 beaver dams on Rapids Rd. and Buckwheat Rd., weed removal around JMF property, put fresh oil and loose gravel sign on S Ayers, took excavator back to George and Swede, took trees out of Murder Creek by Mike Whiting's property, and hired Matt Stolarczyk as of 8/18/2025.

# Resolution - Approve Change Order for Qualprax Masonry - JMF Project:

A motion was made by Councilman Jendrowski, seconded by Councilman Dugan amending the masonry wall project at the JMF to increase the height of the doorways to accommodate machinery with Qualprax Masonry Company in the amount of \$2,383.08. This brings the total of the project to \$30,754.74 and authorizes the Supervisor to take all steps necessary to ensure the Project is completed.

## **Privilege of the Floor/Question Period:**

<u>David Faron, 5691 Crittenden Rd.</u> – he came to the board at the beginning of the year asking the Town to request a speed study on Crittenden Road. The County did not agree to lower the speed limit, but Mr. Faron thanked the board for listening and paying attention to him.

Stan Serwon, 5759 Davison Rd. – has a drainage ditch that runs through a corner of his property that is very overgrown, Superintendent Bassanello will look at it.

There being no further business to come before the board for the regular meeting, a motion was made by Councilman Burke, seconded by Councilman Mutter to adjourn the regular meeting at 7:53pm.
