MOTION by Trustee Casell and seconded by Trustee Cieszki, to authorize the following: Alden Village Board of Trustees Resolution Regarding Black Water Acres Project September 24, 2024

WHEREAS, the Village Board of Trustees of the Village of Alden approved the Site Plan Application submitted by Wetzl Development LLC for the proposed Mixed-Use Development at the Black Waters Subdivision which proposed, among other things, to extend Slade Drive; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Alden Planning Board approved the Final Plat Application for the Black Water Acres Subdivision on September 18, 2024; and

WHEREAS, the Subdivision Map and the Site Plan for the Black Water Acres Project shows the proposed extension of Slade Drive, sidewalks and related water, sewer, and stormwater infrastructure to be dedicated to the Village of Alden; and

WHEREAS, the Property Owner of the real property that comprises the Black Water Acres Subdivision have offered to dedicate as follows:

- A. The Extension of Slade Drive, including sidewalks, from the southernmost point of Slade Drive to a point 305 feet east from the center of the circle as shown on the attached and Survey of the Roadway to Village of Alden; and
- B. Water, Sewer, and Stormwater infrastructure constructed to date from the southernmost point of Slade Drive to a point 305 feet east from the center of the circle as shown on the Black Water Acres Subdivision Map and the approved Site Plan.
- C. All Public Stormwater Easements shown on the attached Easement Map.

Now Therefore Be IT Resolved by the Alden Village Board of Trustees as follows:

- 1. The Village hereby accepts the Extension of Slade Drive, including sidewalks, from the southernmost point of Slade Drive to a point 305 feet east from the center of the circle as shown on the attached and Survey of the Roadway to Village of Alden; and
- 2. The Village hereby accepts the Water, Sewer and Stormwater infrastructure constructed to date from the southernmost point of Slade Drive to a point 305 feet east from the center of the circle as shown on the Black Water Acres Subdivision Map and the approved Site Plan.
- 3. The Mayor is hereby authorized to execute the necessary documentation to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.
- 4. This Resolution is conditioned upon:
 - a. The recording of the Subdivision Map at the Erie County Clerk's Office; and
 - b. The Approval of the Village Attorney, after consultation with Village Officials and the Village Engineer, of the deeds, easements and Stormwater Control Facility Maintenance Agreement and related forms to be recorded at the Erie County Clerk's Office; and

c. The execution of the Wetzl/ARC Slade Drive Dedication Agreement. On the question – no comment, 4 ayes, carried

BUSINESS FROM THE FLOOR

Fred Mitchell, W. Main St. – in agriculture field for 70 years, last 2 years increase in deer population causing concern. At one time had 26 deer in his compost pile. Had 10-12 deer enter his greenhouse eating his off the benches. They have eaten 1/3 of his mums. The code would allow for a 6'fence, but they can clear that, would need a 12' fence, but would affect the neighborhood and the kids' play area The neighbors have salt licks and corn out to feed them. Has cost Mr. Mitchel \$100,000 in losses.

Patty Meckes, Citizens Against Wind Turbines in Lake Erie (CAWTILE) Meckes describes it as a proactive grassroots group for the past 14 years. She explained the massive industrial project –

100 turbines from Buffalo to Dunkirk Close as 2 miles from shore, .6 miles apart Exclusion zone for fishing and recreation Increased energy cost Blades can turn up to 200 mph Bases and cables buried in sediment NYERDA recommends no further development Contamination and pollution and more.

Looking for support to pass a resolution that the Village of Alden would not like to see the placement of wind turbines in Lake Erie.
